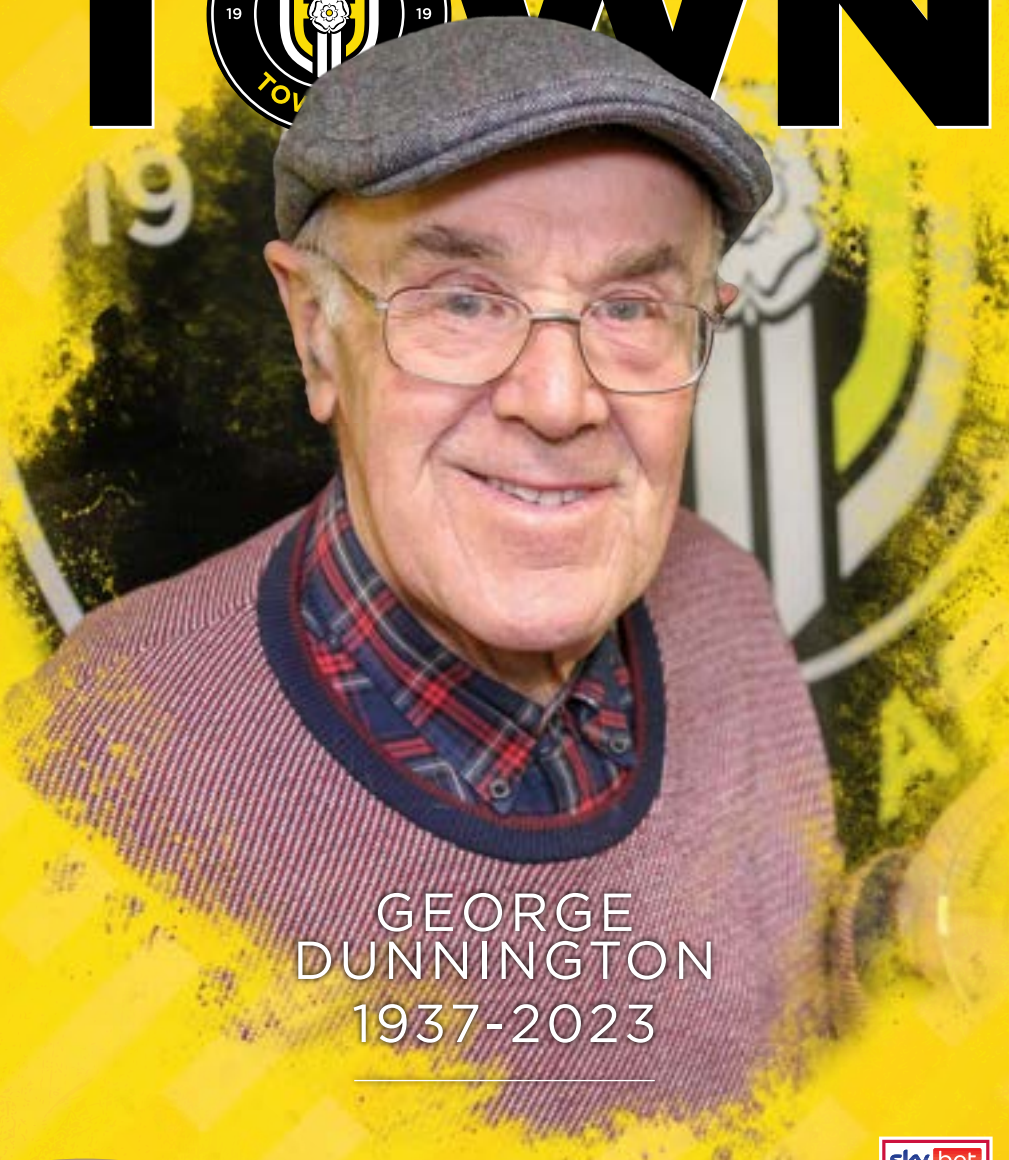

Everyone at Harrogate Town is deeply saddened to hear the news that Life President George Dunnington passed away last Sunday.

George was first involved with the club as a player in the 1950's, but when his playing days came to an end in the 1980's, he helped the club build a brand new stand, floodlights, terracing, turnstiles, changing rooms and much more with his team of workers. Mr Dunnington was then elected Chairman in October 1986, a position he held until 1998.

George was then elected Club President In 2012/13, before being one of the inaugural inductees in the club's Hall of Fame in 2023.

George was an inspiration to everyone at the club, his positivity, friendly nature and determination leaving a lasting legacy at the club he dedicated such a big part of his life to.

Our thoughts are with George's family and loved ones at this time.

Today's match against Morecambe gives our players the opportunity to show a much improved performance compared to last time out against Accrington.

Having watched the game back, our start to the match was no where near good enough. Before going out to training on Monday, we sat the lads down and went through the aspects of the match which weren't good enough.

Collectively, we were lacking desire in all areas of the pitch and having missed an opportunity to make our mark on the game early, we were punished. In being fair, we made some changes at half-time which I think improved our performance because the lads coming on had a point to prove.

However, now it's important that we get that reaction from the first whistle this afternoon because the pressure will be on. In attack, we want the lads to get more shots at goal, we want to have that drive to go forward where possible and see where it takes us.

I was pleased for Warren Burrell to find himself on the scoresheet. He reacted well to Luke's initial header from the set-piece but we want to add more goals from open play.

To do that, we need to find different routes to goal because we looked fantastic against Doncaster but having set the standard, the pressure is on.

Training this week has been good. As coaches we wanted to see a reaction to that disappointment which we shared on Saturday and we have got that. Naturally after a defeat, the door is open to changes and with that in mind the competition amongst the group is in a good place.



Morecambe arrive here on the back of a very good result last time out. They scored three goals, kept a clean sheet and more importantly showed the quality they have in both boxes.

Having watched a lot of them, we have to be organised and aggressive in our press. We want to make it difficult in possession for them and hopefully cause some mistakes as a result of that.

Finally, I would like to take this time to pay tribute to two great men who we have sadly lost in recent weeks. George Dunnington and Paul Richardson are two men who embodied everything which makes this club so special.

In my time as manager here, those two men were fantastic pillars of support and people who I could always go to for advice. I speak for everyone involved here with the football club when I say they will be sorely missed.

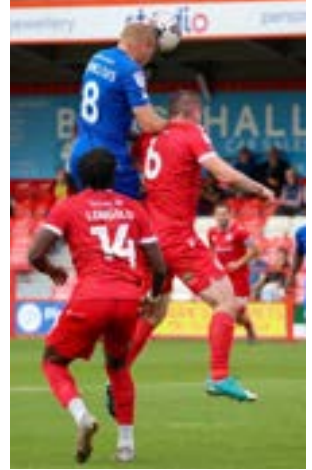

LIAM GIBSON

HAVING GROWN UP A NEWCASTLE FAN, THE OPPORTUNITY TO SIGN FOR THE CLUB, AT THE AGE OF NINE, WAS THE STUFF OF THE DREAMS FOR LIAM GIBSON.

DESPITE THIS, WHEN THE VERSATILE MIDFIELDER SIGNED ON THE DOTTED LINE, FEW WOULD HAVE BELIEVED THE TURMOIL WHICH HE WOULD FACE IN ORDER TO FULFILL HIS AMBITION OF BECOMING A PROFESSIONAL FOOTBALLER.

Speaking on his departure from The Toon, Gibson said: "I knew at the time that I wasn't ready to play for Newcastle. Having supported the club and been there for a number of years it's a little bit devastating. Pulling on that shirt at any level gave me pride because it was my club."

"It was the right time to move on, I have nothing but admiration for the people there and what they did to help me. I am proud to have represented the club, although it wasn't competitively it still meant a lot to me and my family."

However, to fully understand the significance of the midfielder's story, first we must return to when he joined the Premier League side.

"I was about nine years old and playing for my boys club. At that time, we were in a tournament with all the teams in the local area. We ended up going on to win the whole tournament and afterwards my mum came up to us. She told me that a Newcastle scout had approached them and invited me into the development centre to see what I thought of the place. From there it moved pretty quickly, I went in there and ended up getting signed after a year."

Reflecting on this, the former Newcastle man believes the opportunity to be so close to home was hugely beneficial.

"I stayed at home in my scholarship. I know a lot of lads who had to move and a few naturally got home sick. For me, I was still living in my family environment and I knew if there was any downs or low points then they could pick me up."

When Gibson entered the second year of his scholarship, something changed. Town's number 30 noticed a drop in energy levels and as a result, the club began to investigate the potential issue.

"I was in the second year of my scholarship when I started to sense that something was wrong. I didn't feel right in myself, my energy levels were low and I struggled to get out of bed in the morning.

"I ended up speaking to one of my coaches and ended up getting tests done. It was hard, you know how important that second year is for your career, as soon as I spoke to the coaches I was pulled back from training.

"At that time, I was worrying that my time at Newcastle might be cut short because I couldn't prove myself. With that in mind, I probably trained three weeks more than I should have. I definitely think I should have said something a bit earlier, that would have also got the diagnosis that little bit quicker."

Despite these investigations, it took valuable time before a diagnosis of Colitis could be found for Gibson.

"The initial tests couldn't really find anything wrong which was obviously frustrating. After that, we ended up getting a couple of different opinions and after a couple of months, where we went back and forwards, I got the diagnosis of Colitis.

"I was lucky to be in a professional environment with Newcastle, they got me in to see the top specialists in the country. I definitely think it would have taken a lot longer if I didn't have the help of the club. I will always be appreciative of what the club did for me."

As the midfielder began his road to recovery there was a price to pay. Having been prescribed a course of steroids, he quickly noticed the physical impact having been restricted from training.

"To start my treatment I went on a course of steroids but I was sort of in a lose-lose situation. I was starting to feel better but the side effects were starting to have an impact. For example, when you're on steroids, you put on weight quickly and that made me feel a bit down on myself.

"I picked up a blood clot around the same time and that meant I had to take about six months out of football. That was a nightmare but at the time it was about trying to push through and recover as quickly as possible.

"It was a lonely place to be, I spent every day in the gym myself while the lads were out training and I struggled to see an end to the problems. Peter Beardley was the under-23's manager at that time and he was brilliant with us.

"At that end of my scholarship, I think the club were debating whether or not to give me a new deal and I think he played a big role in pushing the club to give me a new deal. After that, it gave me a little bit of peace of mind and meant I could focus on fully recovering."

Having been given the all-clear

to return to football, Gibson was given the opportunity to play for the Newcastle first-team in a pre-season friendly. Reflecting on the experience, Town's number 30 remembers the confidence which this run out instilled in him.

"When I got the all clear to train, I had two stone of weight to lose before I then started to build up my fitness levels to play again.

"At one point I never thought I would play football again. Playing that friendly was a sort of pinch yourself moment. Getting out there and playing was a massive boost for morale especially.

"I spoke to my family and partner after the game, they just kept telling me how proud they were of me. They had seen how much I had to go through to get to this point so to see me back out there must have been a relief."

Little over a year on from his first bout with Colitis, the condition recovered and this time more volatile than before.

"I got myself fit again and went out on loan to Gateshead. That was a great experience because I hadn't experienced senior football before. However, I didn't really play as much as I would have liked so Newcastle recalled me.

"After that, I played for the U23s again until the condition began to flare up again. That definitely felt like a punch in the teeth.

"When I recovered the first time I just assumed that this was all behind me. However, when it came back that was the most difficult time of the illness to be honest. When it flared up the second time it was much more aggressive which is even harder.

"At the time I was in and around the first team. Newcastle had just been relegated so I was hoping that I could break into a couple of squads but that came up. I was watching a lot of my mates begin to kick on with their careers but I was stuck in a bit of a hole."

The decision was made to remove the midfielder's larger bowel. Despite, trepidation Gibson acknowledges this was his only option.

"That decision was purely a medical one. It got to a point where the operation was the only option really so I didn't have a choice. I had already been through this the year before. I now had a bag on my stomach which was the toughest part for me.

"I was a bit nervous when I went back in, I hadn't been around the lads for a while and I felt fragile. Everyone means well, they want to know you're

alright. However, you want to get away from it and it was a bit hard constantly answering the same question.”

After battling through the second battle with Colitis, the then 21-year-old was keen to make up for time he had lost to team mates while on the treatment table.

“My first game back was against Barrow in a pre-season friendly. I would say that is the most nervous I have been for a game because I wanted to go out there and show that I had what it took to play at that level.

“I made a mistake early on and I think that helped me to settle into the game. Running around the pitch and getting on the ball for me it didn't seem real. I have never seen my dad cry but you could tell after this that he was close. That nearly set me away but it was good to have them there because that meant a lot to me.”

“I joined Accrington in the January because I wanted to prove myself in the men's game. However, I think mentality wise I was still a little bit fragile. Being honest, I'm not sure I was ready for League One football. I had only been back for six months but I learned a lot from my time there.

“I needed to be exposed to that kind of environment. After that loan, my outlook on football changed and it helped me to realise where I needed to be.”

A loan move to Grimsby would follow and upon his arrival the versatile midfielder felt ready to prove the doubters wrong.

“I went into Grimsby and this time felt ready to make the step. I played regularly and I felt like I did quite well in the matches. I know there was a little bit of a question mark over me about playing so often.

“At Grimsby I had the chance to play regularly and prove people wrong so that was undoubtedly a confidence boost.”

Following his departure from Newcastle, Gibson signed for League Two side Morecambe. After achieving promotion in his first season with the club the midfielder remembers his time fondly.



“I went to Morecambe and in my first season there we got promoted to League One. At the time, I was struggling a little bit to find a club but luckily Morecambe to a gamble on me. Now, sitting here, I would like to think that I have repaid a bit of that faith.

“We were favourites to go down that year. However, we ended the season with the opportunity to play at Wembley which is something that every lad dreams of, it was brilliant.”

Despite enjoying his time on the Northwest coast, winning the club's Players' Player of the Year award last season, the 26-year-old made the decision to leave the club and join Town.

After hearing of Simon Weaver's interest, the versatile midfielder was eager to secure the deal.

“It was a tough decision to leave, I was settled there but Harrogate were keen to bring me to the club before and as soon as I heard of the interest there was only one place I really wanted to go.

“It's always good to know someone going into a new dressing room. I knew Ant and Luke so I think that helped me to integrate into the group well. The rest of the lads have been brilliant and it's a great group to be part of.”

When asked if he is enjoying his football, Gibson's answer was simple.

“For a long period I never thought I would play competitive football again. Now to sit here, I am so pleased to have the opportunity to play football day-in-day-out with a fantastic group of lads.

“My family have been so supportive of me right through all of this. It was hard for them too, I was down and needed them to pick me up. My partner has been right by my side through the highest highs and the lowest lows.

“My mum, my dad, grandparents and brother too. They were always there for us and I will always appreciate their help and support throughout this period.”

THE BIG MATCH

SEASON 1985/86



CLUB HISTORIAN PHIL HARRISON LOOKS BACK AT SOME BIG GAMES FOR THE CLUB OVER THE YEARS...



The very first time Harrogate Town met Morecambe was in the FA Cup First Qualifying round on Saturday 7 September 1985

Town were a Northern Counties East League Division One side and under Manager Alan Smith finished the season in third place and were promoted to the Premier Division as well as winning the West Riding County Cup 1-0 against Goole Town. Morecambe were then in the Northern Premier League under Joe Wojciechowicz before and they also finished third at the end of the campaign.

Town keeper Graham Robinson was given his big chance replacing Steve Jones after his departure to Harrogate Railway Athletic whilst Morecambe's keeper was Peter McDonnell (once understudy to Ray Clemence at Liverpool) who held a European Cup winners medal from 1977 in Rome.

The match ended 2-0 to the 'Shrimps' with only 182 watching the match at Wetherby Road! There

was nothing in the local paper about the match, just one match action shot seen here. Morecambe eventually went out to York City in the First Round proper played at Maine Road. The Minstermen went on to meet Liverpool in the Fifth Round.

We first met Morecambe in League Two during the 2020/21 season - our first season in the EFL - losing 1-0 away on 12 December and again losing by the same scoreline at home on 20 March 2021 both games without any supporters present due to the Covid pandemic.

Last season we met League One Morecambe in the EFL Trophy and won 2-1 thanks to goals from Finn O'Boyle and Miles Welch-Hayes in front of 717 supporters at The EnviroVent Stadium.

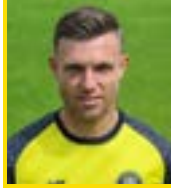

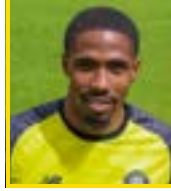

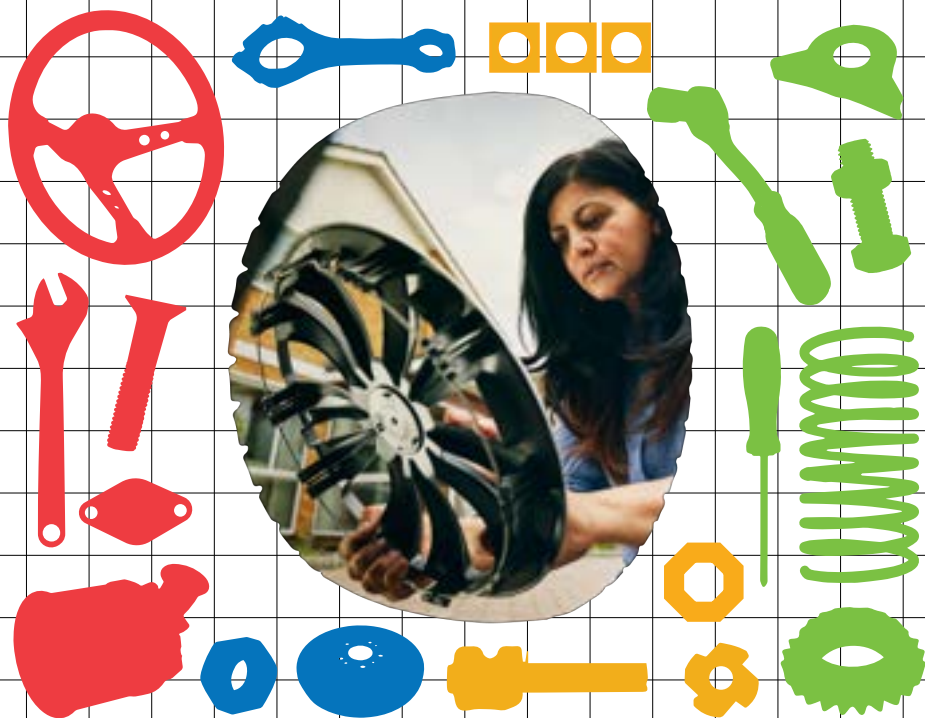
