THE GAFFER

SIMON WEAVER

Coming into this afternoon's match, it feels great to be carrying the confidence and the momentum which we as a group have built in our league fixtures over the last couple of weeks.

We have now picked up three wins from four on that front. However, it's not just about the victories it's about the manner in which they have been achieved. Last Saturday, we had to show a bit of everything to overcome a really strong Newport County side.

We are always working on ways to utilise everything we have in this group, that first goal was a really well worked move and the second comes on the back of good movement from a set piece. However, we had to dig in at times and show that we can see things out when the kitchen sink is being thrown at us.

Taking a break from League action on Tuesday night, we gave several players who haven't played as much the chance to show what they can do. Ultimately, looking at the performance, the way we started the match gave us too much to do in the second half.

We were well short of the standard set just days before at Newport. This season in League Two we have had one of the strongest defences in the division but to concede five goals is a far cry from that.

Despite the disappointment, it's important that we recognise some of the positive aspects of the performance. Looking at our midfield two, George Horbury and Stephen Dooley neither of those two haven't played a lot of minutes recently but I feel they showed a desire and fight from the first whistle to last.

Elsewhere, Sam Folarin scored two good goals, he covered a lot more ground for the team and his fitness levels are going up. That is definitely something we want to see more and more of.



There is no doubt about the fact that we'll need to get back to the level of performance showed last Saturday if we are to come away with a positive result here today. Stockport are no strangers, we have faced them on a number of occasions and they always have the quality and the threat to hurt teams in attack.

They themselves are in really good form, confidence is high in their ranks and watching their recent matches you can see why. However, focusing on our preparation, training this week has been good.

You can see the belief and the desire in the lads to show that they are a match for anyone in this division when on form. While we are pleased by recent performances, we know that we have room to improve.

In order to do that, we need to stay focused on the task at hand, we are pushing to continue that development and to continue working on the things which got us into this position in the first place.





A SENSE OF DELIGHT ECHOED AROUND HARROGATE AT AROUND 11:30PM ON FRIDAY 1ST SEPTEMBER AS FORMER LOANEE AND FANS FAVOURITE JOSH MARCH RETURNED TO THE CLUB. THIS TIME PERMANENTLY. THE FORMER LEANINGTON AND FOREST GREEN MAN HAD ENJOYED A HUGELY SUCCESSFUL LOAN SPELL WITH THE CLUB DURING THE 2020/21 SEASON AND FOUND THE BACK OF THE NET FIVE TIMES.

Reflecting on that first spell, Town's number 24 said: "I think my time here on loan kickstarted my football league career. It gave me the confidence that I could play at this level. I used that loan spell to prove

"The gaffer and Thirs instilled that belief in me. Looking back, it was a perfect move for me because as coaches they suit me and know how to get the best out of me. That's definitely been a reason for coming back. I love the way they work, I love what they are trying to do here and the club is one which I

While his initial loan spell only lasted six months, the forward admits the possibility of returning was always one which remained

"There was always a thought in the back of my head that I would come back. You never know what is going to happen but I always felt like it was a possibility. I played really well when I was here but with my injury last time I always felt like if the opportunity came

"It was quite late in the window. My agent told me of the interest but I wasn't sure how Stevenage thought of it all. I just remained focused on the here and now until my agent called me and said the bid had been

"It was all a bit of a mad rush, I was in central London having my knee drained and I came out to a flat tire. I had to get that changed and get all the way up here so that was quite a stressful day."

However, while Town may have added a forward who has secured promotion to League One on two separate occasions, the forward spent a significant spell of his career playing in non-league football following several unsuccessful spells in academy football.

"I was in and out of academy football at a young age. I had spells with West Brom, Wolves and Aston Villa and I ended up spending about a year with each. However, all three clubs released me because they thought I was too small.

"That's what it was like back then and obviously it led me on to a different route to where I am but I wouldn't change any of it for the world."

"I felt like I was doing well at Wolves and when I heard that I would be aettina released I was devasted. Naturally you rise again and I went back to playing football with my mates which I loved.

"I remember talking to my dad after those meetings. I told him that I wanted to go back to doing that and enjoying Sunday league with my mates.

"I was playing for my local team and I know that some people do stop playing for a bit.

However, I've always seen football as something that I have really enjoyed no matter what it throws at you."

Despite successful spells in non-league football, a move to Alvechurch was where March began his route up the pyramid.

"I started playing men's football for Tipton Town in step 5 and after that the manager left so I ended up moving on from there. I joined Causeway United because I knew one of the lads who played there.

"That was the same league as Tipton and I had a really good season. Thinking back I hit 20 goals for them and on the back of that season I got my move to Alvechurch.

"I think moving to Alvechurch helped me to realise the opportunity I had in non-league football. I was young and for me it was still a case of playing football with my mates. However, Alvechurch were a team that were pushing forward and aiming for promotion.

"I went in there feeling like it was a step up. I wanted to use that to try and work my way up the non-league ladder. Looking at where I am today I'm thankful that I took that decision.

"Playing in the games was the best preparation you could ask for. Alvechurch were a fairly big team for that level and the manager Ian Long is someone who I owe a lot of gratitude to.

"He was up front with me when I went in. He told me I wouldn't play every week but he said there would be plenty of opportunities because they rotate the squad regularly. That honesty and transparency is what drew me to joining because I knew what I was going in to.

"I was playing on the wing but I still managed to contribute 15 or 16 goals in that first season. The season after we got promotion and I scored 36 goals so it was a great season."

Following on from these goalladened seasons, the 26-year-old admits that this helped him to



set high standards for his own performances.

"I felt like I demanded those performance levels from myself. I was a bit naïve at that age and because of the ambitions I do have. I put an expectation on myself to score regularly.

"Setting those standards for yourself is really important. I know what it's like to work in a factory and have to balance that with my football. I always kept grafting when I was balancing both hoping for something to happen and thankfully

In playing part-time for Alvechurch. the forward also had to take on a full-time role in pipe-fitting in order to make the ends meet.

"I was doing pipe fitting with a company just round the corner from my house. It paid the bills at the time and whenever I had a game the guys there would let me leave that little bit early so it was a great understanding.

"I definitely think my time playing and working in a full-time job helps me to appreciate what I have now.

I always do my best to train as hard as I can in every session. I appreciate everything that football has given me and I am always working hard to make sure I can stay in it for as long as I can."

However, with aspirations to continue to climb the pyramid, March eventually took the decision to move to National League North side Leamington.

"My time at Alvechurch was a great period of my life. Those achievements both personally and collectively are really important to me. Also looking back, it's been vital in where I have got to today so I can't thank the coaches and my team mates enough for playing a role in that.

"It was definitely a worry when I made the decision to leave. At the end of that season I felt like it was the right time to move on. I was high in confidence and wanted to test myself in the National League North.

"Leamington wasn't far from where I stayed at that time. I felt ready to go and give it my all at a higher level because I wanted to kick on up the ladder.



"The manager there gave me reassurances, I knew I was going there to be first choice as a central striker and hearing what he had to say I just thought 'why not?' and as it turns out I loved every minute."

It was a move which truly lit the blue touch paper on the forward's career as he found the back of the net 24 times in 27 matches.

"It was a surreal experience. I always backed myself to do well but I didn't quite think it would go that well. When you're in a run like that, you try to take things a single game at a time but you always hear rumors.

"I was still part-time and working on the side. My agent was then an advisor to help guide us to a decision. It was coming up to Christmas and I was speaking to clubs almost every day who were interested.

"Being a full-time footballer has always been the dream for me. I wanted to make sure I joined the right club and with the potential of achieving that dream I wasn't going to let anything stand in my way."

A move to League Two side Forest

Green would come in the January of 2020, for the forward he was joining a club where he felt wanted.

"I felt like Forest Green wanted me the most and for me, I've always wanted to play where I feel valued. I had a great three years there but when I first went in I didn't really feel ready but then covid hit.

"I definitely feel like that helped me, I was able to knuckle down and get into shape for the next season which was just around the corner. I probably came back too fit in hindsight, I ended up breaking down with injury but I wanted to give myself the best opportunity to get back into the side."

"I saw a lot of lads make the step up but they ended up falling back down to National League and I didn't want to do that. That was a big motivator in my off season plan because I wanted to make the most of the opportunity I had in full-time football."

However, following on from a successful loan spell with Town, March headed into his second season with the club high in confidence. "I went into that pre-season feeling like a different player, I was ready to prove that I could play for Forest Green and I ended up getting covid just before the season started. After that, I picked up an injury so it was quite a tough period but I was happy with how the season ended.

"I was playing back-up to the two strikers who were in but I knew I was playing and training well. It was a great group to be a part of and thankfully we had a bit of success there as well.

"You definitely appreciate the promotion more. There were quite a few lads who were in a similar situation to me. Coming from non-league, I think it gives you that extra drive to prove people wrong and to show you can succeed.

"With that in mind, that made me feel a little bit disappointed with my spell at Stevenage because I had a difficult run with injuries. However, that is part and parcel of football, I'm just thankful that I am back fit now and ready to get back playing regularly."

Having made his debut in last month's victory over MK Dons, March was pleased to finally have his opportunity to play in front of the Town faithful

"It was a nice feeling to play in front of the fans, I have never played in front of them before because of covid. Personally, it was just great to be back, no one likes being out injured but when the injury is such a minor issue it's more frustrating.

"Every day you're watching the lads head out to training, I was desperate to get out there with them in those first couple of weeks but I was having to do my work on my own."

Having returned to full-fitness, the forward admits he is excited to see how the competition for places helps him to improve in the months ahead.

"It's a great group, in my position there is strong competition for places which I believe we need. It helps to drive standards and to improve everyone. When you head out on to the pitch, you know your jersey isn't safe, that is the way football should be."

TOWN'S CLUB HISTORIAN PHIL HARRISON LOOKS BACK AT SOME PREVIOUS MEETINGS BETWEEN THE SIDES FROM THE ARCHIVES...

Apart from a first-ever pre-season meeting on Saturday 7 August 1993 when County won 3-0 with goals from 6' 7" Kevin Francis, an own goal by Town keeper Paul Allen and a stunner by substitute Paul Williams, our first ever competitive meeting with Stockport was at Wetherby Road on Saturday 31 August 2013 in the Vanarama Conference North.

County had just been relegated from the Vanarama Conference and the game ended in a 3-1 victory for Town in front of 918 spectators. Goal scorers for Town were Adam Bolder, Michael Woods and Chris Hall with all three goals in five first half minutes, whilst sub, Iain Howard grabbed a consolation for County four minutes from time. The result lifted Town to fifth and Stockport dropped to 21st. Minutes after the match County manager, Ian Bogie resigned after five winless games.

Stockport County: Ormson, Jacobs, O'Halloran, Verma, Fagbola, Charnock, Moke, Tunnicliffe, Craney, Turner, Jevons Subs: Howard, Lofthouse, Duxbury.

The return fixture was the last game of the season and Stockport got their revenge by beating Town 3-1 in front of a crowd of 3,604 with goals from Scott Duxbury and a brace from Phil Jevons and Dominic Rowe for Town.

Under Simon Weaver, his fourth season in charge, Town finished ninth whilst Stockport under Alan Lord, finished 14th. Ashley Worsfold was Town's top scorer with 16 league and cup goals whilst for County Jevons top-scored with 21 goals.



Town U18s got back to winning ways in the EFL Youth Alliance North East with a 4-2 victory at Doncaster Rovers on Saturday.

After a cagey start from both sides, Town keeper Alex Mooney was called into action on 18-minutes making a great reflex save from a shot heading for the top right corner following a wellworked move down the right wing. Apart from that, it was a very evenly contested opening half hour.

On 32-minutes, Finn O'Boyle had Town's first real chance, pressing and robbing the defender of the ball before taking on two players and unleashing a low drive which was blocked for a corner. From the resulting corner, however, Town did take the lead - Jack Bray whipping in a delightful cross which was met by Alfie Lee at the near post to flick the ball past the keeper.

Town doubled their advantage two minutes later when O'Boyle set Bray through 1v1 against the keeper and he calmly slotted it home to make it 2-0.

Doncaster pulled a goal back on 41-minutes when after good work down right hand side, Jaiden Campbell-Ryce placed the ball beyond Mooney's reach.

Town, however, restored their two goal advantage just before half time with Bray grabbing his second with a cheeky dink over the keeper after some intricate passing on the edge of the box sending

Town in 3-1 up at the break.

The second half started with both sides battling to dominate possession. On 57-minutes, Town created a good chance from a counter attack through the middle as Ben Tweed released O'Boyle but his shot flew over the crossbar. As the game really started to open up, Town extended their lead on 64-minutes as O'Bovle unleashed a powerful strike into the top corner to finish off a great team goal created by Josh Brodella and Jack Bray, On 67-minutes, Town had a golden opportunity to make it five, as Lewis Smalley was brought down in the box from a corner, Jack Bray stepped up to take the penalty but the keeper pulled off an outstanding save low to his right.

Doncaster went straight up the other end and got a second from a low shot which was well saved by Mooney but

He started his career under Billy Davies at Preston North End before following Davies to Derby County. He then enjoyed a spells at Oxford United, Bamber Bridge and Northwich Victoria before joining Fylde.

Upon promotion to the EFL, he has remained very much County's number one, missing only one game in 2019/20 in all competitions, and in his time at County, Ben has now made over 300 appearances for the Club and remains a firm fan favourite. The 2020/21 season was one of his most successful in a County shirt, keeping 19 clean sheets in the National League.

ANTONI SARCEVIC

Midfielder Antoni Sarcevic joined Stockport County from Bolton Wanderers in October 2021, having led the Trotters to promotion from League Two as captain the previous season.

Sarcevic came through the Manchester City academy before joining Crewe Alexandra in 2010, then going on loan and signing for Chester in 2011. He then signed for League Two Fleetwood Town in 2013 where he went on to make 138 appearances in three seasons. After a brief spell at Shrewsbury Town, Sarcevic joined Plymouth Argyle in January 2017 and played 132 times for the Pilgrims in four seasons there. He won the Spanish U19s league during his time in Spain, but soon received an offer to join boyhood club Aston Villa moving to Villa Park in 2020. Spells on loan with Ipswich Town and Swindon Town followed during the 2021/22 campaign, whilst last season saw him spend time at MK Dons before finishing the season at Salford City.

FORWARD

Signing from Millwall in January 2023, the 23-year-old came through the academy ranks at The Den, and spent the previous two seasons out on Ioan at Sutton United - becoming a crucial part of the side that secured promotion to the Football League

The pacy frontman finished as Sutton's top scorer in 2020/21 as the U's won the National League title, scoring 16 times in the league. He returned to Gander Green Lane the following season for their first year in League Two, scoring a further nine times in all competitions as Matt Grey's side finished 8th, just outside the play-off places, and reached the final of the Papa John's Trophy at Wembley.
