# STEPHEN JOOLEV

EFL

HAVING SPENT CLOSE TO AN ENTIRE YEAR ON THE SIDELINES, OUR EFL TROPHY MATCH AGAINST ACCRINGTON MARKED AN IMPORTANT STAGE IN STEPHEN DOOLEY'S RETURN FROM INJURY.

THE MIDFIELDER, WHO HAS SUFFERED FROM A HERNIA AND A SEVERE CASE OF OSTEITIS PUBIS WHICH IS AN INFLAMMATORY PELVIC CONDITION, STARTED THE MATCH FOR THE FIRST TIME IN NEARLY 12 MONTHS. REFLECTING ON HIS SPELL ON THE SIDELINES, DOOLEY COULDN'T HIDE HIS DELIGHT AFTER COMPLETING THIS IMPORTANT LANDMARK IN HIS RECOVERY.

# INTERVIEW BY NICKOLAS MCINALLY

"It feels amazing to be back out there to be honest. It is everyone's worst nightmare to be out injured and I was out for so long. I think that time out has helped me to appreciate everything in football more.

"Obviously, collectively we conceded too many goals in that one. It was a tough one to take having scored three on the night and we know we should have done better.

"Personally, it felt good to get through 90 minutes, my body felt good after and it felt great to be involved in a proper game.

"There was a time where I wasn't quite sure if I would get back out there. Now, a year later, to be back involved feels great. It definitely gives you perspective, if I'm having a bad day I can look back at how things were then and know I'm in a much better place now.

"Some days you're going out, it's raining heavily, it's really cold. However, thinking back, this time last year I was stuck inside, in a lot of pain trying to do a training program of exercises. That definitely helps you, not just to train hard but also to enjoy what you are doing."





After signing for the club last summer, Dooley recalls his eagerness to impress and nail down a place in the squad in the early days of last season. However, while doing this, a slight pain in his pelvis began to develop.

"It came on quite quickly really. It was right at the start of the season, I had managed to get through pre-season and felt fine going into the league campaign. At the end of the Crewe game, I started to feel a little bit of pain but I didn't think too much of it.

"After that it crept up on me, the pain and discomfort I was in came up pretty quickly, by the time I eventually stopped playing it had got quite bad.

"I was at a new club and didn't want to stop playing really. Of course, you can start to question yourself and what you are doing. I have had a lot of time to reflect, it's all ifs and buts.

"You can ask yourself what could have been handled differently. However, I tried to carry on as much as possible because I was playing regularly. Eventually, it got worse and worse and it got to the point where I had to stop. Crewe was at the end of August, right through September I was doing everything I can to get through sessions and games. I didn't feel right, I played against Salford and Stockport but ended up getting taken off at half-time in that one. I was desperate to get back in the team and was pushing my body to try and overcome it but I just couldn't.

"I couldn't really do anything without being in pain, I couldn't kick the ball, I couldn't run and that was when I knew I had to say something. I wasn't helping the team, I wasn't helping me and I couldn't really see anyone I was helping by carrying on in that way."

After reporting the issue, the Northern Irish midfielder admits that this was just the beginning of the process as investigations began to understand the route of the discomfort.

"It was a pelvis/groin related injury, it wasn't something I had experienced before. I had to go for MRIs, I had to go for scans and eventually had surgery on it. A lot went into finding out what the issue itself was. There was a lot of moving parts and it was quite a complex injury. Pain in that area is quite difficult because everyone can have pain there for different reasons and that meant we had to do a lot of work to get to the bottom of things. The surgeon thought I had a hernia in there along with some inflammation of the bone. They wanted to repair that and it took a long time to recover. I couldn't really do very much without experiencing pain after."

After a successful operation, the midfielder began his road to recovery but the slow nature of this process was a source of frustration.

"I didn't really have a timeline. There are several injuries with set time frames before you can return and with a program to follow for that return. That would have given me a structure but I didn't have that because of the nature of my injury.

"We had to take things one day or one week at a time. That was definitely tough but eventually we managed to come through the other side. There were weeks where I felt ready to take a step forward. However, when you up the load of what you're doing then my body wouldn't react well. I remember doing that and then the next day waking up in pain.

"After that, it was about trying things out and learning what works and what doesn't. I had good weeks and bad weeks but for me I had to feel



like I was generally heading in the right direction and thankfully recent months have helped me to do that.

"I managed to do a lot of bike sessions which wasn't too painful. However, that isn't the same as running around and being able to be around the lads. I was trying to do anything I could which didn't cause me pain. However, there was a lot of weeks where I wasn't able to do a whole lot.

"It's definitely the worst part of being an athlete. I was at a new club as well of course and I was desperate to get out there and playing so that was definitely a frustration."

With the 31-year-old unable to recover in time for the end of last season, Dooley admitted his attention quickly turned to starting the new season strongly.

"At the end of last season, I knew that I was improving but I wouldn't be ready to go come the start of pre-season. After safety was secured, I felt ready to have a mental break after what had been a tough.

"I wanted to come back in refreshed and ready to go again. Thankfully I was able to do that, I didn't go straight in but I definitely think that we managed my return well.

"I have been training for two months now and so far I've been able to take part in every session since I've come back. That has allowed me to be in a place where I feel ready to return to action."

Reflecting on what was a busy close season, Town's number 22 is pleased to see his hard work paying off.

"You have to do things properly. I was able to do a bit of strength and conditioning work over the close season which I couldn't do last year. I definitely think using my off-season program and having that extra little bit of time off helped me to take a step forward.

"I felt much better and from there things started to pick up. Slowly but surely I was able to get back out on to the pitch. At first, I was doing small sessions, there were a couple of laps of the pitch. From there, I started doing a couple of running exercises and then got to do a little bit work on the ball. Building up slowly like that and it kept going and thankfully I am where I am today." As the midfielder returned to training just over two months ago, Dooley admits he feels a new sense of gratitude for the opportunity to work with his teammates once again.

"It's weird for sure. I was walking out to do something that I hadn't done in so long. Even the rest of the lads have been doing this day-in-day-out for months. However, I think going through what I have gone through has given me a fresh outlook on things.

"I think it's important that you don't get caught up too much on mistakes in training. In the grand scheme of things, if I misplace a pass or mis-control a loose ball then it's not something to be caught up on.

"It's the way you probably should play football. The more freedom you can play with the better you play generally. It's not always easy because there is a lot of external pressure. However, I have a lot of appreciation for where I am and what I have gone through to get here."

In continuing on the road to recovery, Dooley believes playing and training on a regular basis has helped to improve his confidence levels.

"I needed a lot of training under my belt before I could even consider playing in games. I wanted to make sure I was ready and up to the challenge. It was always day-by-day and then week-by-week, I wasn't looking to get ahead of myself.

"I played 70 minutes in the friendly against Guiseley and after that I got a couple of weeks training under my belt before playing against Accrington. I got 90 in that one and I feel like the whole process has been done right.

"I'm ticking off boxes every week, I'm enjoying that process and to get through matches is a huge confidence boost.

"We have a bigger squad so it's difficult. I have been out for a while and the other lads in my position haven't. It'll be tough but I feel like I'm getting fitter and fitter every week, I will keep working hard and see where it takes me."



TOWN'S CLUB HISTORIAN Phil Harrison Looks Back at Town's 1959/60 Season and A Big Win Over Goole

# **BACK IN TIME** Season 1959/60

For 1959/60 campaign Town were a Yorkshire League Division Two side under Manager Jack 'Boss' Townrow, a former Chelsea and England International.

Town signed a wealth of talent this season to put them on the map with Yorkshire league professionals signing and well known local players. Secretary Charles Hartley said, "We've decided to go all out and get the best players that will be the finest Town have fielded. It's often said that Harrogate people will support an outstanding team so we're putting it to the test."

The first team drew their opening game but won the following four and went top of the league. This included a 7-0 home win over Dodworth M.W. with Arthur Everitt bagging four. A 3-0 win at Wetherby Road over local rivals Harrogate Railway Athletic when a crowd of well over 1,000 saw Everitt score two against his former club. In fact Everitt scored ten goals in the first five games. This was the striker's only season at Town during which he scored four hattricks and finished top scorer with 32 league and cup goals from 33 games - the second highest scorer in a season for Town since World War II. He did play one game in 1963/64.

On a snowy Saturday 16 January 1960, Town played their first round WRC Cup game at home against Goole Town Reserves. Town fans were disappointed at not seeing Goole's full first team squad but did see four of their side including Ernest Phillips who skippered York City's famous FA Cup run of 1954/55. It was a dazzling performance of Harrogate teamwork as they hammered Goole 8–0 with a hattrick from Everitt, two from Eric Kelshaw and one a piece from Peter Reynard, Reg Taylor and Bobby Ross.

Town went on to reach the Final but lost 1–0 to Farsley Celtic in a replay and finished fifth in the league.



An early first-half strike from Josh Brodella was cancelled out in the second half by Bradford City as both sides played out a 1-1 draw in the Youth Alliance Cup Group stage.

Despite Town taking an early lead, the first real opportunity of the match fell the way of the home side. As the Bradford striker raced through 1 v 1 with the goalkeeper, a superb last ditch tackle from Lewis Smalley was enough to deal with the danger.

Less than 30 seconds later, Town found themselves in front. A driving run from Josh Brodella saw him work his way into the Bradford box and as he unleashed a shot at goal, the deflected effort hit the back of the net and Town had the lead.

While the home side pushed forward determined to find an equaliser, a promising free kick made it's way to the back post where a lurking

attacker could fire at goal. However, a strong save from Alex Mooney ensure that Town held on to their lead.

Not to be disheartened, the Bantams again looked to ask questions of a determined Town back line. However, another strong save from Mooney and a wayward rebound effort ensured that Town would keep their noses in front.




# ADFN FI INT DFFFNDFR


