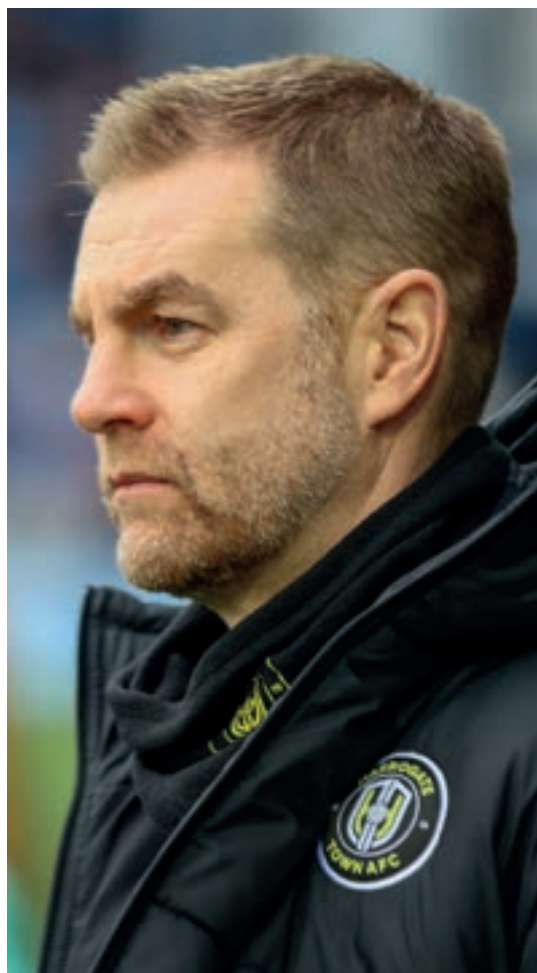

JAMES BELSHAW

WHEN THE NEWS BROKE THAT GOALKEEPER JAMES BELSHAW WOULD BE RETURNING TO HARROGATE TOWN ON A PERMANENT BASIS THERE WAS A SENSE OF MUTUAL WARMTH BETWEEN THE STOPPER AND THE TOWN FAITHFUL.

HOWEVER, WHILE THE DECISION TO REKINDLE A PARTNERSHIP WHICH HAD SAW TWO PROMOTIONS MADE SENSE ON THE PITCH. AWAY FROM THE PITCH, THE MOVE MEANT JUST AS MUCH FOR THE 33-YEAR-OLD.

The former Tamworth man said: **"This move was one which I felt I had to do not just for my career but also for my family too. My wife and I have an eight-month-old daughter together but I had been living away from home three nights a week in Bristol or with Forest Green.**

"However, moving here meant I could move back home and be with them. I am now able to be a full-time dad which is one of the most important things for me. To be able to do that while representing a club like this is an absolute no-brainer.

"People don't see everything which goes on in a transfer, the last three or four weeks have had a lot going on but as a family we are absolutely buzzing to be back here."

As the dust settles on the sensational return, attention now turns to the 18-month term which Belshaw has signed up for.

When asked about the future, the goalkeeper admits he has a debt to settle.

"The last few weeks have been great and I am absolutely delighted to be

back playing in front of the fans here. The club has come so far in the time where I have been away, it is really fantastic to see.

"The permanent deal was something which I wanted to happen, looking at the way the club went above and beyond it was clear that they wanted it to happen. I am forever grateful for that but now it's down to me to repay that faith they have shown in me."

Aside from becoming a husband and father in his time away, a lot has changed for our number 31 who believes he has learned a lot thanks to his spell with Bristol Rovers.

"That Summer after leaving here was a tough one, I spoke to a few clubs during the summer but nothing was really happening with that. There was a couple who said they were interested but nothing came of it.

"It got to the start of pre-season and I actually came back here to do a couple of sessions. However, that first week I got the call from Bristol Rovers who invited me to come down for a two week trial.

"I trained every day and managed to get involved in a couple of pre-

season friendlies and thankfully after that they decided to sign me. However, at first my remit was to go in as second choice which for me wasn't ideal.

"I wanted to play games but it was the only offer I had so I knew I had to make it work. I ended up being on the bench for the first two games but after that the first-choice at the time picked up an injury and I was given the opportunity to play."

However, after being relegated from League One the season before, Belshaw admits it was a difficult start as the club struggled to adapt to the fourth tier.

"The season before the club had just been relegated, there had been a big turnover in players and coming in you could feel that relegation hangover. The fans were unhappy at the previous season and we started the new season slowly on the back of that.

"It was a difficult learning curve for me. However, I was playing week-in-week-out and was happy to have this opportunity and thankfully as we got into the new year our form really started to improve.



“We knew the quality we had in the group. We knew there was the components in there to put a run together and after January I think we only lost three games.

“We knew if we could get a run together then at least making a go of it in the playoffs was achievable. We got into the playoffs about March time but after that in-house we were always looking at the top three positions.

“I had managed to get a couple of clean sheets under my belt and I was enjoying my football. It was a new experience for me. Looking back at that season, I ended up being named POTY and we got promoted to League One so it turned out to be a great season.”

With confidence high, Belshaw highlights a stand-out moment which set Bristol Rovers up for one of the most dramatic final days in EFL history.

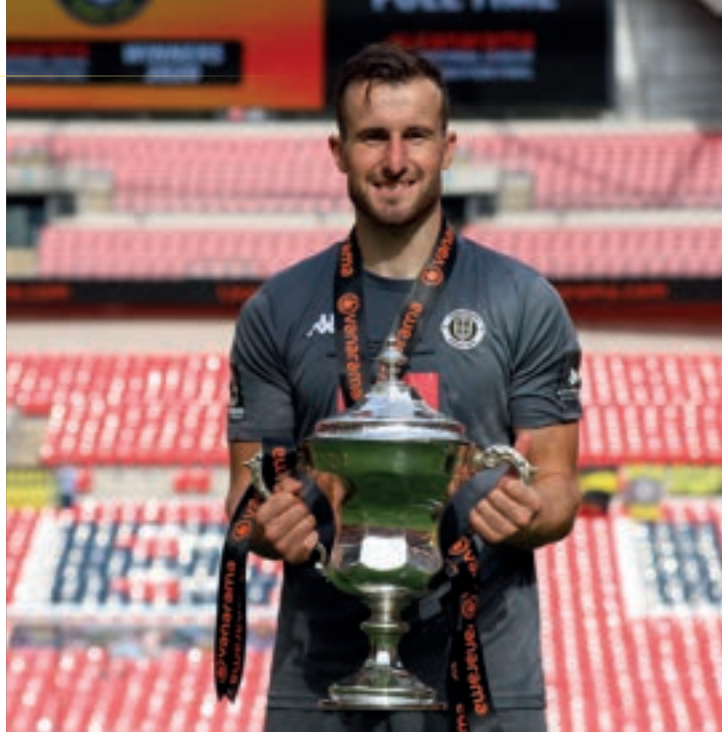
“In the second last game of the season we scored two late goals to turn our game against Rochdale around. That left us level on points with Northampton in third going into the last game of the season.

“There was a feeling in the group that we had one more game left to go and make that dream a reality. However, we were five goals behind Northampton at the time.

“They were away to Barrow and we were at home to Scunthorpe who were already relegated. The atmosphere that day was great but the Northampton score meant we needed to go on and win 7-0.

“We were 2-0 up at half-time but we threw everything at it in the second half. We went 6-0 up and as soon as that went in we just had a feeling that we would go on and do it.

“With 5 minutes or so to go we get the goal and the entire stadium just erupts. After the game, I remember the fans storming the pitch to celebrate with us and that was a special moment.



“I’ve been fortunate to experience three promotions and they have all been special in their own right. To do that from where we were in December is a really proud moment for me.”

With the prospect of playing in League One looming, the 33-year-old admits that was a pinch yourself moment.

“Coming from non-league, I’ve always believed I could play in the football league. However, you never think it is going to happen. I remember signing for Harrogate and beginning on that incredible journey but all of a sudden you’re waiting for the League One fixtures to come out.

“Going up against the likes of Derby, Portsmouth, Charlton and Bolton and being there on merit was a proud moment for me and to do it representing a club like Bristol Rovers was a great achievement for me.”

While things were rosy on the pitch, Belshaw set about having an impact off it by giving back to the local community. Work which saw him rewarded with the Community Champion award two-years running.

“As a footballer, I believe we have a responsibility to give back to the community. They give their hard earned money and time to follow us all over the country so it’s important that we show our appreciation.

“I took on the role of a health ambassador at Bristol Rovers, I worked closely with the people there and did a few talks on mental health in football and to try and promote the awareness of that.

“I think it’s important try to show the human side of footballers too because it can be easy to forget that we are people too. I’ve personally been there and had help at times when I have been struggling so I want to encourage people to do the same.

“If there is anyone out there struggling, I will always encourage them to speak to people and open up because it helped me in difficult periods of my career.”

However, after a conversation with then manager Joey Barton, Belshaw was informed that he would be free to leave Rovers after two successful seasons.



"The manager at Bristol Rovers spoke to me in the summer and said he was bringing another keeper in to play. I was told I could leave the club if an offer came but unfortunately they decided to reject those offers and I was left in a bit of limbo.

"The window closed and I wasn't playing but thankfully the chance to go to Forest Green on an emergency loan came up to keep playing. That turned out to be an extended period and I enjoyed my time with some good people. As that came to an end, I was due to be going back to Bristol Rovers but I got the call from Lloyd Kerry to ask me if I would be interested and I was up for it."

Representing a new club brings it's own challenges but the air of familiarity rang true as Belshaw received a warm welcome in the first match of his emergency loan spell against Notts County.

"I always try and work to the mindset of being a good person first and a good player second. It was really humbling to have so many positive interactions with fans before and after that first game.

"When you sign for a new club, there is always a little bit of pressure to show what you can do. However, at the Notts County game I didn't have that. The fans here knew me and knew what I was about."

Discussing the bonds with his new teammates, Belshaw was full of praise for the 'old guard' who the stopper believes deserve a lot of credit.

"The culture of the football club means there is a close knit group here. We have good people and for me, you can see signs of the teams I have been part of in the past.

"Those four lads are the best group of players I have had the privilege of sharing a dressing room with. Falks, Thommo, Mullers and Waz have stayed with Harrogate right through this journey.

"In that time, a lot of players have come and gone but they have stayed and been a key part of the success on and off the pitch.

"To come back and share a dressing room with them is an honour, I'd consider them my best mates in

football so I am really enjoying playing with them again."

Of course, with at least 18 months left in the James Belshaw & Harrogate Town story attention now turns to what is to come.

"What happened before was special. However, for this club to be an established football league club is testament to all the people working hard here behind the scenes. That hard work and those values has stood the test of time. I think the quality of the group has improved but the attitude and the core values here have remained the same.

"When I left the first time, it felt a bit bitter sweet to be honest given what we had achieved. However, I've gone away had the experience at Bristol Rovers but I feel like I have improved in that time. I feel more mature, more experienced and a better goalkeeper too. For me, coming back is about progressing the football club, it's about seeing how far we can take it because now we are looking at kicking on and climbing the table again."

2003/04 was Town's last season in Northern Premier league as big changes were planned for non-league football for the following season with a Conference league of 22 clubs and a new regionalised Conference two (North and South) below that run by a 'New alliance'.

As a result Town applied to join the new 'Conference 2' league because if they remained in NPL, they would then find themselves two divisions below the Conference and it would be like relegation in a way. To be successful, Town had to finish in the top half of the table in 2003/04, along with sides from the North Midlands otherwise they would remain in the NPL.

Still under Manager John Reed, Town had another good season and for the last home game in NPL Premier Division (Unibond) on Saturday 17 April 2004 basement club Wakefield & Emley were thrashed 5-0 for Town's biggest league win of the campaign.

Manager Reed told the local paper 'of the goalscorers', 'Marc Smith scored with a great volley and an opportunistic goal while Mick McNaughton capped a brilliant performance with a bullet header. James Turley then scored

a firecracker to make it four but the goal which gave me most pleasure was Mark Atkins because there was seven or eight people involved in the move leading up to the finish.'

When the final whistle blew, 17 years of Unibond league football ended at Wetherby Road but in front of only 381 supporters!

Town finished the season in fifth place so would be accepted into the new league the following season. Wakefield & Emley finished bottom of the pile and were relegated to NPL Division One.



When the final whistle blew, 17 years of Unibond League football ended at Wetherby Road.

James Turley was Town's top scorer with 19 league and cup goals. Town's average home league crowd by then was 488.

Town were now a 'Conference club' for the newly formed Conference North for the 2004/05 season.

The U's announced Danny Cowley as their new head coach at the beginning of January following the departure of Matthew Etherington on New Years Day. Earning plenty of experience in their early management days in Essex, Danny and his brother Nicky had spells at Concord Rangers and Braintree Town before making a name for themselves at Lincoln City.

Gaining promotion from the National League in their first season, they won the EFL Trophy in their first season back in

the EFL before a title-winning season in League Two in 2019.

The following season, they departed for pastures new, and Championship side Huddersfield Town, helping the Terriers to maintain their second-tier status having been relegation-threatened earlier in the season.

Their next club was Portsmouth in League One, where they held a good win ratio, but narrowly missed out on the play-offs at Fratton Park.

MEET SOME KEY MEN FOR THE U'S

CONNOR HALL

Former Town player, Connor Hall joined the U's from Port Vale in last season's January transfer window. The centre back spent a season and a half at the League One side and played a big role in helping Vale get promoted last season. He was also heavily involved in Town's promotion to the EFL in the 2019/20, playing 33 games, and then played 41 times in Town's first season in League Two. Hall was named as the U's new captain over the summer.

NOAH CHILVERS

Noah was taken into the Colchester United academy at the age of nine and progressed through to make his debut for the first team as a late sub in 2019. He then joined National League South side Bath City on loan in October 2019. On the back of his breakthrough season in 2020/21, Chilvers was named both Colchester United 'Player of the Year' and 'Young Player of the Year'. Almost ever-present again this season, Noah has surpassed 150 games for the U's.



ARTHUR READ

Joining the U's from Stevenage in the January transfer window of last season, the box-to-box midfielder had spent the last two and a half seasons at the Lamex Stadium, with the first half of his first season being on loan from Brentford. He started his career at Luton Town, from U9s level all the way up to the 2018/19 season, and although he didn't manage to make any League appearances for the Hatters, he did make seven appearances for them in the seasons he was there.

JAYDEN FEVRIER

Jayden Fevrier was brought into Colchester United's U21s side in October of 2022 and has since broken into the first team match day squad after impressing with the young U's. The young midfielder was brought into the side after being released from the West Ham academy in July of 2022. He's a versatile player that's played on both the left and right of midfield and has also dropped back to play as a left-back.

CAMERON MCGEEHAN

Joining the U's in September after he returned to the UK, having spent three years at KV Oostende, the 28-year-old started his football journey at Fulham's Academy, before Chelsea paid a five figure fee for him at the age of ten. In 2011, he signed for Norwich, and captained the Canaries' youngsters as they won the 2012/13 FA Youth Cup. Loan spells at Luton and Cambridge followed, before a permanent move to Kenilworth Road in the summer of 2015. Two years later, he was snapped up by Championship side Barnsley, before heading to the Belgian top flight for three years. On the international front, McGeehan has represented Northern Ireland at U17, U19s and U21s levels, and made his senior debut in March 2023.

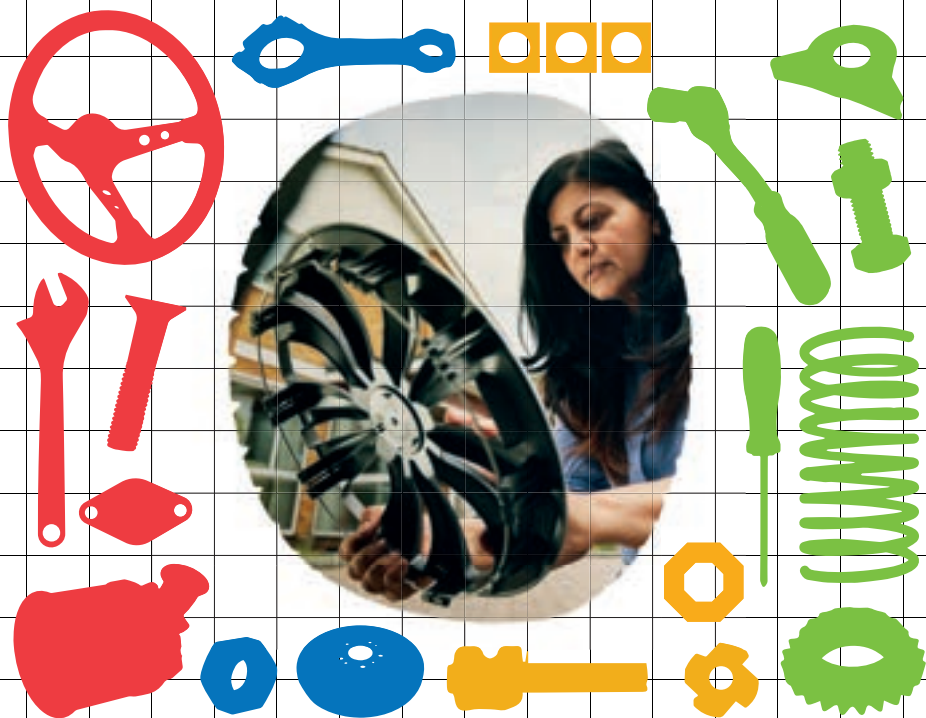
