# LEWIS THOMAS

**GOALKEEPER AND TYPE ONE DIABETIC LEWIS THOMAS BELIEVES HIS LONG STANDING MEDICAL CONDITION HAS HELPED HIM IN HIS JOURNEY TO BECOME A PROFESSIONAL FOOTBALLER.**

**THE 22-YEAR-OLD WAS DIAGNOSED WITH THE CONDITION AT THE AGE OF NINE SHORTLY AFTER TAKING UP THE HOBBY OF PLAYING FOOTBALL REGULARLY.**

INTERVIEW BY NICKOLAS MCINALLY

Speaking on the conditions implications, the former Manchester City and Burnley stopper said:

"I think being a type one diabetic helps me, I have always had to be a little bit more switched on with regards to what I eat and what I drink even from an early age.

"I tried to use that to my advantage, when I was younger I had a lot of puppy fat and I used to be quite a big lad but that slimmed off as I got to 13 or 14.

"After that, I moved away from home and I was making my own way to school. I was making my own breakfast but I knew I needed to eat the right things.

"I couldn't just have a guess, I needed to know what was in food, how much of that is in there before deciding if I could eat that.

"I was diagnosed as diabetic one week after I started playing football. The timing of that helps because

since I've been playing it has been second nature to be considering that.

"Naturally, when I was younger it was difficult to get it right. My mum and dad were extremely important in helping me get that right.

"Being a young kid, enjoying my football I think there would be times where I was feeling a bit rough but wanted to play through it. They helped me to realise that doing that wasn't good for me in the long term."

Having spent close to three years training in the Leicester City academy set up, Thomas was offered the opportunity to move north and join Manchester City and continue his development.

However, as a type one diabetic, the challenge of moving away from home was a difficult one to accept for both Thomas and his family.

"When I was 14, I decided I wanted to leave Leicester and at that time it just felt right for me to move on. We

spoke to some agents and wrote to a number of different clubs to let them know that I would be leaving.

"Manchester City got back to me pretty much straight away and from there things progressed quickly. I was going to make the move when I was a little bit younger but my mum didn't want me to leave home as young so I had to hold off a little bit.

"I think there was a lot of reassurance from the club for my mum and dad. They were naturally worried for me being so young but City put me into digs with house parents there.

"They were then given training on how to deal with diabetes. They were learning on food preparation, injections and everything else that comes with diabetes. That was a massive help for them, my mum and dad knew that I wasn't there on my own and I had people there if I need them.

"I still think they found the first couple of months hard. I was out and



enjoying my football but they were back home worrying about me. I didn't realise how much a stress it was for them at the time.

"After a couple of months, they would be visiting regularly and they realised that I had learned what I needed to do to look after myself and thankfully from there I think they were more settled with it."

As Thomas began to progress through the age ranks within the City academy, the goalkeeper recalls the influence the club's senior figures had on him both on and off the pitch.

"The goalkeeper coach at the time would spend as much time with us as he could. It was difficult to train with the first team because it was so regimented for them.

"We did get involved with the first-team goalkeepers on occasion. That was good to see them so closely, I learned what they did and compared it to what I was doing at that time.

"Of course, being 15 it's hard to hold your own training with the likes of Joe Hart but I just set out to use those opportunities to learn as much as I could."

"Off the pitch was massive, they were really nice people and you could see them treating people in the right way. That has always been a big thing for me to treat everyone with the same level of respect.

"Working with guys like that, you could see them being like that off the pitch and it definitely rubs off on you.

However, his time in Manchester would be short lived as the goalkeeper made the decision to move on in search of more regular opportunities to impress.

"I was about 17 and I realised there was a lot of goalkeepers who were in front of me in the queue. The club had signed a few from abroad as well so I knew my opportunities would be limited.

"I ended up going on trial with a lot of different teams Bournemouth, Blackburn and Burnley. I was really



fortunate to have a few offers from different teams but when I went to Burnley everything just felt right.

"The goalkeeper coach was Craig Mawson who is at Manchester United now. Going in there, everything just clicked and I felt welcomed by everyone.

"Sean Dyche was the manager and I challenged myself to go out there and play a different style which I thought would get me more prepared for playing at lower league football rather than just being able to do what Premier League teams do.

"I think I needed to take on a challenge like that."

With more opportunities to train alongside the first-team goalkeepers, Thomas praised the influence which former Burnley and current Newcastle goalkeeper Nick Pope had on developing his confidence between the sticks.

"The first team training was a lot closer to the academy training. There were a lot more opportunities for us to

join in first-team training and that is what you want.

"Training with them a few times a week was great. We had some good coaches at U23s level Steve Stone helped to prepare you mentally to go and play under Sean Dyche.

"I remember how nervous I felt during the first few training sessions. Everyone's watching you can actually feel yourself shaking, which is obviously hard as a kid. That eventually disappeared and I was able to kick on from there.

"The first-team keepers who were there when I joined was Joe Hart, Nick Pope and Wayne Hennessey. Nick Pope was one of the nicest people I have ever come across in football. He really looked after me.

"That helped me feel settled, sometimes you can feel so far off it because you aren't with the group regularly and you are making the step up but having someone like that looking after you helps massively."

Having spent four years training



and playing with the club's U23 side, Town's number 13 was offered the opportunity to train with Town in the final week of last season.

With his current contract with the Clarets coming to an end, Thomas recalls his first involvement with Town with fond memories.

"I was 21 at the time and I'm one of the older ones in the U23 team. At that point, the experience of playing U23s football wasn't doing enough for me anymore.

"I needed to get some bit more out of it so I looked at the possibility of going out on loan. However, it was difficult to find loan moves that Burnley were happy with.

"The opportunity came up to train with Harrogate for the final week or so of the season and I really enjoyed it.

"I remember getting the phone call from my agent, I was playing Xbox and he told me that Harrogate wanted me to come in and train for a few days.

"I ended up staying with my girlfriends

family in Sheffield and then drove over to train at the stadium. At that point, I had a really nice feeling because everything seemed to click for me.

"It was a really nice group, everyone made me feel welcomed. The coaches were great to work with and being around the club you could sense there was a family feeling in all this."

Having spent the opening weeks of the season deputising for Mark Oxley, Thomas was handed his senior debut against Crewe earlier this season.

However, the 22-year-old admits this was a bitter sweet moment.

"I wanted to improve and had the opportunity to work with Mark Oxley at the time who is a really experienced keeper.

"He has been great with me, spending time with him I have learned a lot. He has a lot of experiences in the game and it's good to have that opportunity to pick his brains.

"Obviously making my debut was tough, everyone wants to play football there is no hiding that but to see Ox pick up a serious injury like that was difficult.

"We were up against a really good Crewe side and we were losing at the time. He just wished me luck as he came off and that just sums up the type of person he is really.

"I didn't really have time to think about it, I was changing my boots on the bench and got a tap on the back and sent to get ready.

"It was a surreal feeling because before you know it, I am on the pitch playing in my first league game and enjoying a moment I had been working towards since I was 10."

A full debut would follow in the FA Cup First Round against Marine. However, shortly after experiencing this, Thomas would find himself on the treatment table having suffered a serious ankle injury in training.

"It was tough for me, because I've had

quite a lot of injuries in my career but a lot of them you can play through and manage. However, this was a different feeling all together.

"As soon as I went down I felt it. I knew there was something serious there and I had to wait a week or so for a diagnosis. That came back and it was probably worst case scenario.

"At that point, I had no choice but to think positively, I knew I was going to be out for the best part of 16 weeks which was difficult. Thankfully, I am nearly at the end of the road now and the focus is just on playing football."

"After my surgery, I had two weeks of not being able to go downstairs and not being able to walk just having my foot raised and my girlfriend did pretty much everything for me.

"Without her, I wouldn't be able to get through that period as easy. My mum and dad came to visit me and few times, they did everything they could to keep me positive.

"There are a lot of times when you do feel down, you are watching games and seeing the lads pick up results but my family and friends around me helped to keep me in a good headspace.

"Obviously, since then I have been able to work closely with James Belshaw and Jonathan Mitchell, they are two really nice guys and have played hundreds of EFL games between them.

"I have the opportunity to learn from all these guys every week during games but also in training."

Reflecting on his first season of senior football, Thomas believes there are plenty of positives to take.

"I think it has been an enjoyable season for me, my first season in men's football. I have been part of a close knit group and one that is fighting together for the same goal.

"We have been battling away at the right end of the table. We are a club looking to improve and with that comes a pressure but it's one we all enjoy playing under."

# BACK IN TIME

## SATURDAY 16 NOVEMBER 2002



TOWN'S CLUB HISTORIAN  
PHIL HARRISON LOOKS BACK  
AT A MEMORABLE GAME  
IN OUR HISTORY




**This was Town's first ever season in the Premier Division of the Northern Premier League and it was a good start with an opening day 4-0 victory at Altrincham to go top of the league.**

Town, under John Reed, were also successful in the FA Cup and West Riding County Cup. In the FA Cup, they reached the First Round proper for the first time ever, which brought EFL clubs into the draw for the first time, as prior to that, they had entered at the Second Qualifying Round stage.

Town beat NWCL Great Harwood Town 2-0 but then met eventual runaway NPL Premier Division Champions Accrington Stanley in the third qualifying round. After a 0-0 draw, Town beat Accy 3-2 at home in a 0-0 draw before beating them 3-0 at Wetherby Road. It was then a long journey on Saturday 16 November 2002 to play in Hampshire against Farnborough Town managed by Graham Westley.

In a crazy first half in front of a crowd of 1,090, Harrogate went behind in the second minute after Rocky Baptiste slotted home before Tony Taggart doubled the hosts' advantage in the sixth minute. Town's Colin Hunter scored on 11 minutes with a super volley (he still watches today) to half the deficit, however, Farnborough's Ken Charlery struck two minutes later and then Lenny Piper rounded the Town keeper in the 21st minute to make it 4-1. A bad back pass gifted Baptiste a fifth after 35 minutes and Harrogate were well beaten 5-1.

This was the furthest Harrogate had travelled to a competitive game to date. That season Farnborough met Arsenal in the fourth round proper. Town and Harrogate Railway Athletic both reached the first round proper this campaign and it is believed it is the first time two non-league clubs from the same Town had reached this stage of the competition.

Clemence, 45, the son of former England goalkeeper Ray Clemence, arrived at Priestfield having coached at a number of clubs, including in the Premier League. He worked closely with Steve Bruce at Sunderland, Hull City, Aston Villa, Sheffield Wednesday, Newcastle United and West Bromwich Albion and won promotion to the Premier League while with Hull as Assistant Head Coach in 2016. As a player Clemence came through the youth ranks at Tottenham Hotspur and made his professional debut in the

Premier League in August 1997. He went on to make 108 appearances in total while at White Hart Lane. In January 2003 he joined Birmingham City for a reported £250,000 and made 125 appearances for the club across a four-and-half year spell, before joining Leicester City in July 2007 but, due to injury, he was limited to making just 34 appearances, scoring three times. He decided to retire due to a heel injury in Easter of 2010 and the midfielder then decided on a career in coaching.



After a three-year spell at Roots Hall, Dieng joined Exeter and was voted their "Player of the Year" at the end of the 2021/22 season.

Joining the Gills on a season-long loan from Huddersfield Town in the Summer, the 26-year-old started his career at Blackburn Rovers, and made his professional debut while with Accrington Stanley in August 2013 before returning to Ewood Park a few months later, initially as part of the club's development setup. He made his first appearance for Rovers in January 2014.

In the summer of 2017 the winger moved to Bournemouth but, with first-team opportunities limited had loan spells at both Birmingham and Barnsley before moving to Millwall in July 2019. During his time at The Den he made 68 appearances and scored five goals. Last summer, he joined Huddersfield Town. Connor has represented England at U17, U18 and U20 level.


