
Jack Muldoon gets the first goal, and for me, he is someone who just keeps getting better with age. He was a handful and the Forest Green defence struggled to cope with him at times.

Welcome to today's game against Grimsby Town. Let's hope Town can continue their recent run of form and come away another three points.

As was announced last week, the Harrogate Town AFC Hall of Fame was delighted to welcome three new inductees; Ernest Baines, Bob Morphet and Dave Merris.



Ernest Baines

Inducted into the Hall of Fame in recognition of being Captain of the 1926/27 Yorkshire League Championship winning side.

Harrogate were the first team to win the Yorkshire League double under his captaincy and also won the West Riding County Cup at Elland Road when they brought the cup home in the motor Chara-a-banc. Baines also captained the 1925 WRC Cup winning side at Elland Road and after returning to Harrogate was carried shoulder high in a procession to the Prospect hotel for a dinner. Baines was skipper for five seasons, playing 216 games between 1919-28.



Horace (Bob) Morphet

Inducted into the Hall of Fame in recognition of his 44 goals from 33 games to help Harrogate AFC win the 1926/27 Yorkshire league title.

Bob played for Harrogate from 1923 to 1928, scoring 64 goals in 48 games and is 11th in the list

of all time scorers. In the 1927 West Riding County Cup final at Elland Road when Harroaate beat Selby 2-1, Morphet scored both goals and the Herald reporter wrote of the winning aoal, 'As Morphet gathered a pass from Smith and crashed the ball home hats, sticks and umbrellas were flung in the air while respectable law abiding citizens became ravina lunatics for the moment.

Morphet was a talented sportsman

and also played cricket for Harrogate Cricket Club.

Dave Merris

Inducted into the Hall of Fame in recognition for his time at Wetherby Road as a player, having three spells at Town.

Merris is fourth in the all time list of league and cup appearances for the club having played 380 games between 1999-2003, 2006-08 and 2012-14. Merris helped Town win the Northern Premier league Division One title for 2001/02 and three West Riding County Cups 2001/02, 2002/03 and 2007/08.

Formal letters have be sent confirming the selection to join the Hall of Fame and the three latest members of the Hall of Fame will be inducted in February 2024.

peaking on the achievement, Thomson said: "When you sign for a club you never quite think you will go on to hit such a landmark. I have loved every minute so far and I still do. Hopefully I can hit that milestone and go on to close in on the next one.

"Every week we go out, we want to try and prove a point. Every single one of the old guard have been to the nonleague. A lot of us have also been told we aren't good enough. I have always had that in the back of my mind and it has driven me to always try to prove a point. I am always trying to strive to do better, we don't want to settle for where we are."

While discussing his seven seasons with the club, the 31-year-old revealed the pleasure shows no signs of wavering.

"It's certainly up there in terms of the most I've enjoyed my football here. Once you get into the rhythm of playing every week then I think you can enjoy the experience that little bit more.

"You know your job, you know your responsibilities and you go out there every week to perform." In discussing his goalscoring form, the winger said: "I'm not sure what has brought this run on to be honest, I am shooting more now when I get into good positions, there has been a few times this season where I have found myself in the right place at the right time.

"It's great to be scoring goals but it's true what the cliché says because the most important thing right now is the results and the position we are in as a team. We have accumulated a lot of points so far this season, we are in a great position as we go into the new year. That gives us the opportunity to kick-on and see what we can achieve between now and the end of the season."

With the team and Thomson in good form, it goes without saying that belief is high.

"Confidence is naturally high when you are on a good run of form, any player will tell you that. It is so much more enjoyable when you are winning games. That is the best feeling in football and it's been great to enjoy a strong first-half of the season.

"Having said that, if you are out there playing games every week

the results have to be there for you to fully enjoy it. I have been here for seven years now, I have enjoyed a lot of success here but the best seasons come when the team are playing well and achieving.

"You can see in this group, we are all pulling together and we are getting our rewards for that. The results now are bringing us closer and closer together and I think that brings competition for places. It is a really healthy position to be in, we are putting some great performances in and naturally everyone wants to play their part in that so the standard in training is really good."

Despite the strong start to the season, the attacker has been discussing a difficult start to preseason which left him with ground to make up.

"I got injured at Mansfield towards the end of last season, I had my operation in May so coming back I was on the back foot a little bit.

"I did a lot with Ben our S&C Coach as well as Rachel & Emily in the physio department to get back as quickly as possible. We went to Scotland and I really started to build myself up gradually. That got us into a great



place in-terms of my fitness and strength.

"Looking back, I think it was probably better to have that enforced break where I couldn't do anything. I took the time to rest after my surgery and come the start of the season I felt ready."

However, a return to the first-team was far from certain, with several new additions to the squad Thomson kept faith in his ability.

"Going into the new season, I felt ready and we had enjoyed another year at this level so physically we know what we are going to expect. I obviously had to bide my time a little bit to get that opportunity.

"Speaking to the gaffer and Thirs, they still wanted me to go out and play my game. Their message hasn't changed in that sense and of course there is strong competition for places but they simplified it to make sure I wasn't overplaying or trying too hard to impress

"It always takes a bit of time, new signings coming in need to settle and get used to the way in which we try to play. I think we saw that a little bit at the start of the season to be honest but now we are starting to see several players coming out their shells a little bit."

Thomson patience was rewarded as he was handed his first start of the season against Morecambe and since then has not looked back.

"I hadn't really played before the Morecambe game. That was my first start of the season and I managed to get on the scoresheet which obviously helped with our belief.

"It's a great feeling to be able to score and win but I would happily trade the opportunity to win and not score to see the team get the three points."

Reflecting on the current campaign, our number seven has identified September's win over Salford as pivotal at that stage of the campaign.



"We had never beaten Salford and for the lads who have been here for a number of years, it was always in the back of our minds. When we were coming up through the leagues it was always us and them so of course we were desperate to come out on top.

"We were 2-0 up and got pegged back to 2-2 and that required a lot of character and determination to go on and win it. It was a great game to be involved in but to get the three points over Salford was nice."

Despite a disappointing start to the season with regards to home form, Thomson has praised the squad for their efforts and quality to improve on the situation.

"The home form was spoken about a lot at the beginning of the season. However, now it is a great feeling to not have that hanging over us. Everyone is now settled and relaxed, we have been on a good run at home and you can see that in recent performance. "If we can keep that up, we can definitely keep looking up the way because winning games and putting in good performances is only going to feed that belief."

The winger was also quick to praise the squad for their performances away from home this season which has led to a lot of points accumulated on the road this season.

"The way we have performed so far away from home is definitely a big part of our recent success. We have been resolute, solid and clinical to play without the ball.

"That has shown another positive to this side. We have that ability to stay in games, which is really important at this level. We have also been able nick a couple of results.

"The away form has been important but I do think we are starting to see our home form improving too. Looking at the second half of the season, that gives us belief and drive to keep looking up the way.



"The first goal is really important at this level and we found that out the hard way in our first couple of years. However, I think the whole team is learning as we go along but having an experienced core now has also played a huge part in that."

With the recent departure of Luke Armstrong, Thomson believes the club's forward players have played their part in replacing his goalscoring threat.

"Luke was brilliant for us, he scored a lot of goals for us in his time here. However, I wouldn't say I viewed it as my sole responsibility to replace those goals.

"I just wanted to go out and contribute as an attacking player to the team. I think that is the same for all the attacking players we have, the goals are being shared around a little bit and that can only be a good thing."

With his performances leading by example, Thomson also discussed the responsibility of taking the captain's armband on a number of occasions this season.

"It is a challenge which I have enjoyed to be honest, I wouldn't shy away from a responsibility like that, heading out I always try to lead by example and this has been no different. When you have that armband you have to be a voice, you have to organize as well as focus on your own game.

"It's been a nice experience for me, obviously when Falks plays he is captain and he has been my captain for seven years. I have big shoes to fill when I take that armband.

"I know how much of a leader he is, I have enjoyed the challenge and when I have the armband it's a challenge I will try to match with the best of my ability."

As we approach the end of the first month of the year, the 31-year-old believes a strong end to 2023 has provided momentum to build on this year. "It was a very good Christmas period for us to be honest, I think we had an extra game in there too and we have put ourselves in a really good position. There was a lot of football but we got into a place where we kept churning out performances and getting rewards for that. We didn't want to be on the back foot as we come into the new year, now we have put ourselves in a great position."

"We have carried momentum into the new year, it's a big month for us but we feel like mentally and physically we are in a good place.

"However, we have to keep pushing, we have to keep trying to better ourselves to make sure that we continue that. Everyone is going to be needed and if we do match that, there is no reason why we can't have a great season."

TOWN'S CLUB HISTORIAN PHIL HARRISON LOOKS BACK AT A PREVIOUS GAME BETWEEN THE TWO SIDES



Apart from two home pre-season games against Grimsby Town on 4 August 2001 resulting in a 2-2 draw and a 0-2 loss prior to the 2014/15 season, our first competitive game against The Mariners was an FA Cup Fourth Qualifying Round tie at Wetherby Road an Saturday 24 October 2015.

After National League North Harrogate, under Simon Weaver, had seen off Workington 1–0 and Burscough 3–0 in previous rounds, Town were drawn to play Paul Hurst's Grimsby Town from the National League. In fact Weaver's assistant manager, John McDermott, had spent 20 years with Grimsby and holds the club's all time record of 751 appearances.

The match attracted a crowd of 1,920 and Town took the lead on 12 minutes through Brendon Daniels with a shot into the top corner. The Mariners, however, came back and won 4–1 in the end with goals from Padraig Amond (34, 70), Omar Bogle (56 pen), Nathan Arnold (57) and Amond (70).

Grimsby: McKeown, Tait, Pearson, Nsiala, Townsend, East, Disley, Clay, Arnold, Bogle, Amond Subs: Venney, Pittman. Grimsby eventually went out 1-0 at Shrewsbury Town in the Second Round proper after taking the Shrews to a replay.

That season Town finished fourth in NLN and Grimsby were also fourth in NL and promoted back to the Football League through the play-offs after beating Forest Green Rovers 3-1 in the Final.

Brendon Daniels was Town's top scorer with 25 league and cup goals from 46 games and Padraig Amond top scored with 37 from 50 games for Grimsby.

The next time we met up was in the EFL Trophy in our debut EFL season in early September 2020 and a 2-2 draw. Our first league encounter was at Blundell Park in mid-October and a Jack Muldoon brace meant Town came away with a 2-0 win and we completed the double with a 1-0 victory in February thanks to a Mark Beck goal.

The Mariners appointed former Crewe Alexandra boss David Artell as their new head coach in November following the departure of Paul Hurst.

The 42-year-old had a playing career spanning almost 500 matches with clubs including Morecambe, Crewe Alexandra and Mansfield Town. He also won seven international caps for Gibraltar and, after retiring as a player, went into management with Crewe in January 2017 after impressing their board with his work in the Academy. Joining midway through the 2016/17 season, he steered the Railwaymen

clear of relegation. After finishing 17th, he continued the upward trajectory the following season and gained plaudits for selecting a starting eleven in May 2018. Three seasons of steady progress led into the 2019/20 campaign and Artell was able to steer Crewe to promotion with his side sitting top of the table when the season was ended early due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

He was the eighth longest-serving manager in English league football before he departed Gresty Road following their relegation to League Two late in the 2021/22 campaign.

Joining Grimsby last summer after their return to the EFL, his switch from FC Halifax Town came after almost 150 appearances for the Shaymen across four seasons. After spending his youth with Bolton Wanderers, he made his EFL debut while on loan with Blackpool in early 2015. He signed for Bury and spent the 2016/17 season with the Shakers before short spells with Galway United and AFC Telford United preceeded his move to Halifax

Coming through the youth system at Crewe Alexandra, the 28-year-old dropped into non-league to get regular first team action - firstly on loan at Leek Town and then at Nantwich Town before moving to Altrincham in Summer 2019. Across that spell with Alty, he made over 100 appearances and earned the captaincy before joining Rochdale in January 2023. After suffering relegation with Dale last term, the Mariners brought the defender to Blundell Park



KAMIL CONTEH

Sierra Leone international Kamil sianed for Town over the Summer after impressing on loan at Gateshead in the National League last season. He spent time in the Crystal Palace youth setup ahead of a switch to Watford where he signed his first pro deal in July 2021 and made his first team debut in January 2022, A loan spell with Braintree Town followed shortly after before, in the summer of 2022, he earned a move to Middlesbrough.



HARRY CLIFTON

After coming through the Mariners youth system where he'd been since the age of 10, the 25-year-old midfielder signed his first pro contract in 2015. He joined NPL Premier Division side Grantham Town in September 2016, initially on a month's loan deal, but this was extended until the end of the 2016-17 season. Since his return to Blundell Park and making his full debut in 2017, Clifton has been ever-present in the first team and has now made over 200 appearances for the club.

Joining the Mariners this summer, the 28-year-old's senior career started with Uxbridge in 2015. Two seasons with them preceded a move to Wealdstone in 2017 before he signed for Shrewsbury Town in January 2018. A year later, he joined Colchester United on loan before signing for Scunthorpe United the following summer. Two seasons at Glanford Park saw him score 14 goals in 67 league appearances before he joined Bradford City in June 2021 but an injury-hit spell saw him limited to just 18 appearances.

Rose came through the ranks at Barnsley before a loan spell with Bury in Spring 2014 led to a permanent move that summer. In October 2020, Rose joined League One Northampton Town before moving Stevenage in the June 2021.


