
MEET NEW ACADEMY MANAGER

RICHARD JONES

HAVING RECENTLY BEEN PROMOTED TO BECOME THE CLUB'S NEW ACADEMY MANAGER, RICHARD JONES IS AIMING TO LEARN FROM PREDECESSORS JOSH LAW AND PAUL STANSFIELD WHILE IN CHARGE OF TOWN'S YOUNG SCHOLARS.

THE FORMER HEAD OF EDUCATION & PLAYER CARE OFFICIALLY MADE THE STEP UP LAST MONTH. HOWEVER, JONES BELIEVES THE RECENT RESTRUCTURE OF THE ACADEMY STAFF CAN HELP MAINTAIN THE SUCCESS OF THE GROUP.

"It's a privilege to be sitting here today as the club's new Academy Manager, obviously I have been here from the very start and now I have had this trust placed in me.


"I joined the club in 2020 when we started the education programme alongside the football. I have had various roles and now to step up from Head of Education & Player Care to become the Academy Manager is something which I am really pleased with.

"I come from an education background but I have supported the club right since joining and hopefully now I can continue to give more and more back within my new role.

"Coming into the role, I benefit from a really good foundation which was laid by both Paul Stansfield and Josh Law before me. I have a really good relationship with them both and I know I can go to them both for advice whenever I need it.

"To lose someone like Josh is a huge loss for the club. However, we have a close knit group of staff here all with their own skills and strengths. Rory McArdle as our lead PDP Coach is a huge asset in terms of coaching and now he is supported by Josh Walsh.

"Walshy has been a huge part of the Player Development Centre for some time now so I think the academy side can benefit from his coaching ability as well.



"The lads have another familiar face there to coach them moving forward. We are pleased to have another opportunity to promote from within and Josh comes in understanding the club's values and the style of play which we are looking to implement.

"Rory will lead on coaching but Josh will be a good voice to have alongside him. He knows the players and is someone who I have enjoyed a good relationship with in my time with the club."

Despite this success, Jones insists the club will continue to do all it can to ensure the players continue to develop the player off the pitch as well as on it.

"We are constantly trying to strike the right balance to be honest. We want to make sure that we utilise the expertise within our staff to ensure the lads here get as much from their time with the club as possible.

"We are a football club but we also want to make sure we get things right off the pitch too. That is a big reason why they are here as players and it's on us to make sure they tie in what they learn on the pitch with what they learn in the classroom.

"Obviously, I had vacated my role of Head of Education & Player Care but on the back of that, it was really important for us to make sure that role was filled by the right person.

"Kate joined us in September last year and we have been really impressed by her work since then. The education and lessons she creates with the lads is helping them to engage with that side of their apprenticeship.

"We were really pleased when she agreed to take on that responsibility because she is a strong addition to the staff we have. She has really good experience in teaching and she has been able to support one of the lads to do their A-Levels while playing for us."

Having achieved league success in the previous campaign, Jones is pleased to see several scholars having the opportunity to experience men's football through the pathway of work experience.

"Player care is a hugely important thing in the modern football academy, we are looking at the transition up to men's football and how we can smooth that over where possible.

"This year, we have been able to get a lot of the lads out on loan to experience first-team football. Sitting here now, the majority of our second year lads have experienced men's football and last year that wasn't the case.

"With doing that, we have to make sure that we communicate well with the players and the families. They need to understand why they are being sent out on loan and what doors it opens up to them in the future.

"It's always beneficial for them to go out and experience men's football. Doing that can help them to see the wider picture, the end goal of these scholarships is to play senior football.

"Of course, we would like that to be here with Harrogate Town but that won't always







be the case. We have to make sure they are aware of what to expect before they sign a contract or before they go to represent a team on a more regular basis.

"They have to want to go out on loan at the same time, we have to explain that decision in a way in which they understand. We are sending them out to improve their skillset while also exposing them to an experience which should help them.

"They aren't going to be apprentice footballers forever, there is going to come a time where they have to go out and experience men's football. However, we have to make sure they are ready for that and we do that by making sure they have the tools to be a success."

In doing this, Jones also believes there is a benefit for the first-year scholars who are required to step up and play for the club's academy side.

"When we have lads out on loan, we have the first-year lads to step up and play for the academy side. This also mean the lads coming back have to compete for their place because the first-years are doing so well.

"It's that healthy competition for places that we are looking to encourage. We are hoping that the first-years will be ready to go out and experience first-team football next season."

However, with this fresh approach, the club's Academy Manager is keen to receive

feedback from players to develop the approach moving forward.

"We have regular reviews to them on an individual basis, when the lads are going out on loan, we try to do one of them and we do another when they come back to see what they have learned.

"We find out if the loan has worked but if it hasn't we can sit down with them to learn why it hasn't. It's important for us to learn what we can improve on for the next circumstance."

With the new season fast approaching, Jones already has one eye on recruitment for next season.

"Over the coming months, we will be looking at recruitment for next season and that will be very important for us. We will look within our U16s team and within the local area to make sure we are getting as many local lads into the squad as possible.

"Of course, we want to use the assets we have at our disposal to improve the standard of footballers in the local area. The club's Player Development Centre is a fantastic way to develop players through the age groups and hopefully we can use that more and more moving forward."

While second year scholars approach the end of their apprenticeships, Jones hopes the club can provide a strong platform for whatever is to come next.

"Coming into this role, the big thing for me is to make sure the lads have a positive progression in their time with us. Their apprenticeship will finish but we want to give them

the platform to go on to something from here.

"We have had lads in the past who have gone to part-time clubs, U23 level football, scholarship football in America but also lads who have started a completely different apprenticeship away from football.

"A lot of our lads have been spending time living in accommodation and being away from home for the first time. That is a challenge in itself and it's nice to see the progression they make in their time with us."

However, Jones also praised the maturity shown by the group in preparation for what is to come next.

"The second year lads who are with us, they are very clever and exploring all their options. They aren't hanging their hats on getting a contract, they are looking at universities and potentially going to play abroad.

"To see them making those efforts is really pleasing. Their mindset and forward planning is a sign of how far they have come. The education they have received is fantastic and the maturity it has brought perfectly summarises what we aim to achieve."



U13 APDC WIN MUFC EMERGING TALENT TOURNAMENT



Town's U13 Boys APDC were triumphant at the Manchester United Emerging Talent Tournament this week.

Hosted at the former first team training ground, The Cliff, the boys were able to play on the same pitch as previous Premier League, Champions League and World Cup winners in an historic setting.

A LOOK AT WHAT OUR SCHOLARS HAVE BEEN UP TO AWAY FROM THE PITCH RECENTLY

JOE THOMPSON - Joe Thompson delivered a workshop to the academy players with the key message of resilience. Joe experienced adversity in a different light, as he battled cancer part way through his football career. A great inspiration to the academy players and great to have him back in.

SURGE PADEL – The lads had a different type of training session as part of team building at Surge Padel, Hornbeam. Pogdan was very accommodating and lads loved the experience of a different sport.

JOE LEESLEY - Former Town player, Joe Leesley delivered a resilience workshop to the second year players. He has first hand experience with the club and gaffer, Simon Weaver, having spent time at the club through their past promotions. He explained the importance of determination and ability to bounce-back from loans, injuries etc. He shared his experiences as a footballer and going both up and down the ladder of football levels.

EPIC GAMBLING MANAGEMENT - Simon Haworth (ex-pro) delivered a workshop regarding the risks of gambling addiction particularly being in a football environment - photo attached.

RED STAR FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT – Kersten and Nick both came in to explain the importance of budgeting, tax, investments and car insurance - all important factors at the stage the academy players are at. This included looking at professional footballers wages and take home pay. They offered advice on how to budget and invisible spending (such as tapping contactless) - outgoings that the lads may not notice, but all add up.
