LEST WE FORGET



Good afternoon and welcome to the Envirotest Stadium for today's game against Swindon Town, a fixture which we have chosen as our Remembrance Match.

In the presence of Andrew Jones MP and the Mayor of Harrogate, Cllr Michael Harrison, we honour and thank all the men and women of our Armed Forces who have committed themselves to defending us and our way of life. Many in the stadium today have family members and friends who served in armed conflicts.

Sadly, some of these Veterans sustained life-changing injuries. Some never returned. These include several of the Club's original playing squad. Seventeen players and the Club Secretary enlisted immediately at the start of the First World War in September 1914. Many did not return. The Club Committee cancelled the opening Northern League match at Bishop Auckland and decided it would be inappropriate for matches to be played until hostilities had ceased. The Club was reformed in 1919.

Harrogate players served with distinction in the World Wars.

Lieutenant G Tolley was awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal for his First World War service.

Eric Stephenson played for the Club prior to joining Leeds United for whom he made over 100 appearances. In 1938 he played for England alongside Stanley Matthews. He was killed in September 1944 when serving as a Major in the Gurkha Rifles.

Jack Syson was in the Royal Navy in 1939-45. He scored 62 goals in 60 games for Harrogate Town in the early 1950's. **Private E Baker** was killed in action with the Kings Own Yorkshire Light Infantry. **Geoff Lund**, long-serving Hotspsurs and Town centre half, fought in Italy and Austria. **Roy Dalby**, Club Secretary in the 80's and 90's, was instrumental in the Club becoming a Limited Company. In the Second World War he was a Lance Bombardier in the Royal Artillery and taken prisoner in Greece. And there are many other Town players, officials and supporters who served in the various arms of the military.

I would like to thank Club Historian Phil Harrison for providing all the above information.

We are also indebted to **Lt Col Mike Butler**, Commanding Officer of **The Army Apprentice College** at Penny Pot for allowing a contingent of Young Soldiers from the College to be at today's match. As well as giving

their considerable vocal support to the teams, they will provide an **Honour Guard** for the participants in the pre-match ceremonies. The Team Captains will lay poppy wreaths. **Alan Pitchfork** and **Paul Darley** of the **Royal British Legion** will lower the Standard, The Last Post will be played by **Craig Buchan**, a prominent local musician and a Trustee of our Community Foundation. Directly before kick-off the match referee will lead us in observing a Minute's Silence.

HTAFC Community Foundation is running our usual matchday lottery and has agreed that the proceeds are shared between the Foundation and the Veterans' organisations represented at today's match:

- The Royal British Legion
- ABF - The Soldiers' Charity
- BLESMA - The Limbless Veterans

SIMON WEAVER

FROM BONFIRES TO BOLTON: A WILD FA CUP RIDE WITH HARROGATE TOWN

Ah, the magical world of the FA Cup, where ordinary folks become heroes and Nokia 3210s become the lifelines of destiny. Let me take you back to the unforgettable clash between Torquay and Harrogate Town in 2012, a day when my daughter's friend's birthday party took a back seat to football glory.

As fate would have it, I found myself in the car after dropping my daughter off at her friend's party, glued to the radio, and on the edge of my seat during the last 10 minutes of the game. It felt like 40 minutes of nail-biting tension. When the final whistle blew, I celebrated like a kid who just found out school was cancelled for a week. My partner, Tricia, asked the golden question, "What does this mean?" With a grin, I replied, "You'll soon see." Little did I know, my mobile would soon become the hotline to football fame. Who could forget, Chib Chilaka's 20th minute winning goal.

The Yorkshire Evening Post was on the line, eager to speak to the press officer - did we have one! My number was on the website for the bookings/info for the 1919 venue. With promises to call back, I embarked on a mission to fulfil my parental duties and attend the Stray Bonfire.

But fate had more in store. ITV called for background info on the players, hoping to add a touch of personal flair to the upcoming highlights program. No token postmen in our squad, but there was Paul Beesley, the removal man famous for lugging three-seater sofas downstairs solo. As the calls piled up, I bid farewell to family firework fun for a rendezvous with Sky Sports' Andy who was a producer for Sky Sports, I was half-expecting a prank, but after 10 convincing minutes, we were set for a live feed at the clubhouse and fan reactions. Hello, stardom!

The Stray was alive with the explosive chaos of fireworks, my Nokia 3210 clinging to its last bar of life. Seeking refuge in the nearest pub, I navigated the call storm as the sky burst into colourful mayhem.

Sunday morning arrived, Sky Sports had set up, and fans flocked in anticipation. Harrogate, having never breached the first round, had the chance to etch their name

SAM FOLARIN

TOWN'S IN-FORM FORWARD SAM FOLARIN BELIEVES A LICENSE TO EXPRESS HIMSELF HAS BEEN KEY TO HIS STRONG START TO THE SEASON. THIS START HAS SEEN TOWN'S NUMBER 12 ELEVATE HIMSELF TO BECOME ONE OF THE FIRST NAME'S ON SIMON WEAVER'S TEAM SHEET.

Reflecting on his time with the club so far, Folarin said: "Last season was my first playing in front of a crowd and that is a completely different experience for me. There is more of a mental challenge there because there is a group of people that are doing everything they can to see their side win.

"I was coming back from injury when I signed, I hadn't enjoyed the best of loan spell and I was low in confidence. The gaffer and Thirs are great people to work with. They showed faith in me from the first day I walked in.

"They've told me that they want me to excite fans and hearing that gave me that confidence to prove what I have. I am grateful for that faith from them to give me that freedom.

"It was a tough end to the season last year. We were playing to stay out of a relegation fight. I remember I got a start against Walsall and as I walked down the tunnel I was thinking that it's now or never for me. That was a good win and I scored to help the team,

that was a great feeling and from there I felt like I started to show what I was capable of."

In discussing this 'now or never' mindset, Folarin revealed this is something which grew on him after signing for non-league side Tooting & Mitcham United.

"When I was younger, I definitely played football for fun. I always had a few people telling me that I was good enough to make a career. However, I still didn't really take it all that seriously.

That is probably why it took some time for me to make it to the professional game. Going to Tooting & Mitcham, the coaches there helped me to get my head screwed on.

"I'm forever grateful to the coaches I worked with there. They changed my mind set and helped me stay on the path which got me to where I am today. It was in my second season there, I was speaking to my coaches and in that I recognised that I could

potentially change my parents life by playing football."

While enjoying life in South London, the forward believed it was time to head further afield in pursuit of this aim.

"I had a trial at that age with Millwall who were my local team. I didn't really enjoy it there and didn't finish the trial. I was also at Reading for a couple of weeks. For me, the distance between London and Reading was just too much.

"I really enjoyed living in South London. However, if you have the chance to better yourself, you don't want to stay in the same place for the rest of your life. That motivation drove me and still does to this day.

"Knowing that those chances had been and gone, in that second season with Tooting & Mitcham it definitely felt like it was now or never. I remember speaking to a Chelsea scout after one of our games that season.

“Obviously, I wasn’t offered a trial there but he pulled me aside and gave me words of encouragement. He reiterated the fact that I could have a career from football and that kind of shocked me.”

As Folarin began to find his way in the game, the then midfielder quickly realised an attribute which very few could match, his pace.

Looking back on his earlier career, the 23-year-old believes this gave him confidence to stand out from the crowd.

“I think I was about 11 when I realised just how quick I was. I was playing in central midfield for my district and I would get the ball from deep and drive forward. That definitely gave me confidence. Every time I have gone up a level, I’ve believed that no one at that level can match me for pace.

“Having pace, you go out knowing it’s going to be a bit of a mental game there as well. Your opponent is always going to try and stop you but I always have belief that eventually I will get my opportunity. When that time comes, you’re either through on goal or have an opportunity to make something happen.”

Having set out to forge a career with Tooting & Mitcham United, Folarin soon crossed paths with someone who he would later share a professional dressing room with.

When asked about Abraham Odoh, the winger believes Town’s number 9 added to the belief he had in achieving his ambitions.

“It’s crazy how things like that come around. Abraham was playing for the first-team there and I was playing for the U23 side. Seeing him have trials with Charlton and the likes gave me even more belief.

“I watched him and knew that I was capable of achieving that as well. To be back on the same team now is crazy. We knew each other when we were starting out and now we are playing together at this level it’s strange how these things work out.”

Soon, the offer of a two-week trial with Middlesbrough would arrive and in making the long trip North, Folarin wouldn’t look back.

“I was there for a two week trial and being that far away from home was a bit of a struggle to be honest. I was living in Darlington and didn’t know the area so that was a culture shock. When I signed permanently, I knew it was a sacrifice to leave home but it was one which I was willing to make. The first year I was homesick and used to go home a little bit.

“After a while, I was able to adapt to it and within our group, there was team mates who were from London and in a similar situation to me and that definitely brought a bit of home feeling. Comparing non-league to playing at Middlesbrough, there was so much more to the game than just talent. Making the move improved my understanding of the game, the manager gave me more responsibility and it was a lot to learn.”

“Physically too, going into full-time football my body felt like it was in bits at first. It’s not an easy thing to go from playing part-time to doing it every day. There was a difficult transition because I was training from Monday to Sunday but it was a bigger picture than that

“I was young and learning how to be a professional away from the pitch too. I wasn’t just turning up and playing football, I was learning how to prepare both mentally and physically to be at my very best all the time.

“I managed to train a couple of times with the first-team as well, the manager at the time was Neil Warnock and he gave me a couple of opportunities to play during the covid season and that was great.

“That was another step up in quality. Every training session felt like a match setting because everyone involved was so desperate to play.”

The winger wouldn’t have to wait long before he was given his debut for Boro and soon after scored his first goal for the club.

“That covid season was definitely tough away from the pitch. I was living in Darlington and because of restrictions, I couldn’t go home. That was probably more of a mental challenge but I had to stay strong and make sure it didn’t affect my football.

“During that season, I made my debut for the club in the Carabao Cup against Barnsley. Obviously, there was no supporters in the stadium and my family couldn’t come to the game so that was hard.

“Without the fans, the game just felt like another U21 game because there was no atmosphere. I actually think my League Two debut last year felt better because I was playing in front of fans. I started the match on the bench and just before half-time there was an injury and I got brought on to play. It was a surreal feeling because within 10 minutes of coming on I had scored which felt great.

“I couldn’t believe that I had scored, even after the game got going again I felt like I was in a bit of a day dream but unfortunately we lost the tie so it was a bit of mixed emotions.”

With momentum on his side, Town’s number 12 was keen to capitalise on these experiences by heading out on loan. However, fate would ensure this was not to be.

“After that, there was a chance that I could have gone out on loan to play regularly. However, for whatever reason, it didn’t happen in the January transfer window. I was playing with the U23s and waiting for the summer window. It was always in the plans to go out on loan from that but unfortunately towards the end of the season I picked up an injury.

“That stopped me from playing for four or five months. I ruptured the ligament in my ankle and that meant I couldn’t get out and play somewhere. It was probably one of the toughest spells of my career so far. I was desperate to play and eventually got myself back fit. However, about eight weeks later, I picked up another ligament injury in my other ankle.



"That stopped me from playing for about a month. However, thankfully I got back just in time for the January transfer window. A couple of weeks later, I ended up joining Queen of the South on loan in Scotland.

"Looking back, I still feel like I was trying to overcome the injury so it wasn't the best of times. I didn't play very often and it was a completely different ball game up there. It was a very physical level, I found it hard to stay fit but it was a spell which I learned a lot from."

Having returned to Teeside, the forward would soon be on the move once again. However, this time permanently and looking back to the Deadline Day deal, Folarin recalls the hectic nature of the transfer.

"I went back to Middlesbrough and knew I needed a fresh challenge. I went from academy football to men's football which is one of the biggest steps forward you can take.

"I heard of the interest but it was a late one on deadline day. The later it got, the more I began to think that I would be staying at Middlesbrough. I remember I was playing Xbox with my mates at 6 and I got a phone call from my agent.

"He told me of the interest and the fact that the club wanted to sign me permanently. That was a tough decision to make in less than an hour but life is about taking risks and looking where I am today, I am really pleased with the choice I made."

A year on, Folarin believes the support of the club's backroom staff has given him a platform to improve so far this season.

"I was trying to make sure I came back from pre-season stronger than last season. We play a lot of games over the course of a season and it's about being as fit for as many of them as is possible.

"It's been a good start to the season for me. I haven't played up front very often but playing that role I am learning all the time about myself. I took a lot of confidence from the Carlisle game because they are a League One side.

"We are doing a lot of work away from the pitch too. Ben our S&C Coach is helping me to make sure I'm eating and fueling my body properly. Rachel and Emily are our physios and they are always testing our strengths every week and helping us to stay in the best possible shape. With a lot of competition for places, it's important that we do the small things to make sure that we stay at the top of our game and show the coaches what we can do in training."

BACK IN TIME SEASON 1940/41



TOWN'S CLUB HISTORIAN
PHIL HARRISON LOOKS
BACK AT THE 1940/41 SEASON



In September 1940 the Harrogate District FA found that it was possible to run the Harrogate League again as all service teams were keen on participating.

By early October arrangements were made for a full programme with matches to be 60 minutes (30 minutes each way). For the second War time year, Harrogate Hotspurs (the pre-cursor to Harrogate Town) joined the Harrogate League to minimise travelling having previously played in the West Riding County Amateur League. They played their home games at Wetherby Road ground-sharing with RAF No. 1 team throughout the War years.

Ten teams formed the league, six Service and four civilian namely,

Beckwithshaw, Christ Church Old Boys, Hotspurs, Pannal Ash, GPO, RAF, Royal Artillery, Royal Signals, Northern Command Depot and Civil Service.

The opening game of the season on Saturday 26 October 1940 was against the GPO at Oatlands School, Oatlands Drive and Hotspurs thrashed them 9-0 with goals from Everitt 4, Lund 3 and Outing 2.

Hotspurs Team: Carne, Wilkins, Richardson, Whittall, Mayor, Dawson, Cowan, Outing, Lund, 'Codge' Everitt, Lobley.

On Wednesday 28 May 1941 the season drew to a close at Wetherby Road with the Whitworth Cup Final. Wetherby Rovers had won the previous year and Spurs hoped to keep the local flag flying against a strong HM Forces combination the Royal Artillery, and did so, defeating

them, and in doing so, getting revenge on a heavy league defeat in December. The Harrogate Charity Cup Final on Wednesday 4 June also involved the 'Spurs' but they lost to Christ Church Old Boys.

In other news, the local paper wrote that 3,000 vehicles were running on home produced fuel and the Minister of Mines encouraged the wider use of producer gas and other substitutes for petrol, perhaps an idea for today with the outrageous prices!

A brace from Jack Bray at the Crown Point Arena was the difference between Town and Rochdale in the FA Youth Cup as Rory McArdle's side came from behind to book a Round Two trip to Northampton Town.

Knowing the importance of the FA Youth Cup, the lads were hungry to go as far as possible in the competition and this was demonstrated by a cagey opening 10 minutes with both teams happy to have possession of the ball and play themselves into the game knowing what was at stake.

Around the quarter of an hour mark, Rochdale took the lead following a set piece. A floated ball into the box was pinballing around the six-yard box and as Adam Pow attempted to clear, the ball rather fortuitously cannoned off the Rochdale winger Oscar Kelly and in to the net.

It didn't take Town long to respond as on 22 minutes, following a corner, Bray had the ball at his feet and performed a cute Cruyff turn before being upended by a Dale defender. The referee had no choice but to point to the spot. Bray stepped up and converted his penalty opting to

go straight down the middle as the keeper dived to his left. It stayed 1-1 into the break.

Both sides came out raring to go in the second half, and in the 49th minute, Bray notched his second of the game with a simple tap in from point blank range. It was a well-worked move stemming from the left wing before Josh Brodella cut it back from the by-line for Bray to score and put Town 2-1 up.

From there on in, chances were few and far between with Town getting a foothold on the game with Alfie Lee, Robbie Wilson and Ollie Nicholson winning the physical battle in the centre of the park and Rochdale posing little threat on Mooney's goal.

In the 75th-minute, a moment of madness saw Dale forward Darren Ehimamiegbo being shown a straight red card for lashing out at Lee. It didn't do the hosts any favours and Town were able to see out the rest of the game comfortably for a hard-fought but well-deserved win.

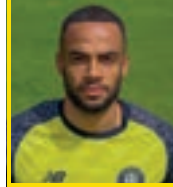

FRAZIER BLAKE-TRACY DEFENDER

Originally joining Swindon in August 2022 on a season-long loan from Burton Albion, the 28-year-old started his career in non-league, with Dereham Town, Lowestoft Town and then King's Lynn, where he was two short of making 100 appearances for the club.

In July 2019, he was snapped up by League One Peterborough United, making 24 starts for the Posh.

Following his release, Burton Albion signed the versatile defender, appearing seven times for The Brewers. After an impressive campaign for Town last season, where he made 24 league appearances to date, the Robins made his stay permanent over the Summer.

DANIEL KEMP MIDFIELDER

Kemp joined the Reds on a season-long loan in the Summer from MK Dons.

The 24-year-old graduated from West Ham United's academy back in 2015 and despite making several EFL Trophy appearances for the Hammers, Kemp had loan spells at Stevenage and Blackpool across the 2020-21 season before moving to Leyton Orient prior to the start of the 2021-22 season. Impressing during his time with Orient, it earned him a move to his current club MK Dons in League One, where he has currently made 10 appearances in the third tier of English football.

He spent last season at Hartlepool United, scoring nine times in 16 games.

Austin finished the 2014/15 season as the Premier League's fourth highest goal scorer, with 18 and two England caps.

In January 2016, a reported £4m fee took him to Southampton before moving to West Bromwich Albion in August 2019 and then returning back to QPR in January 2021 before embarking on his Australian adventure in mid-2022.

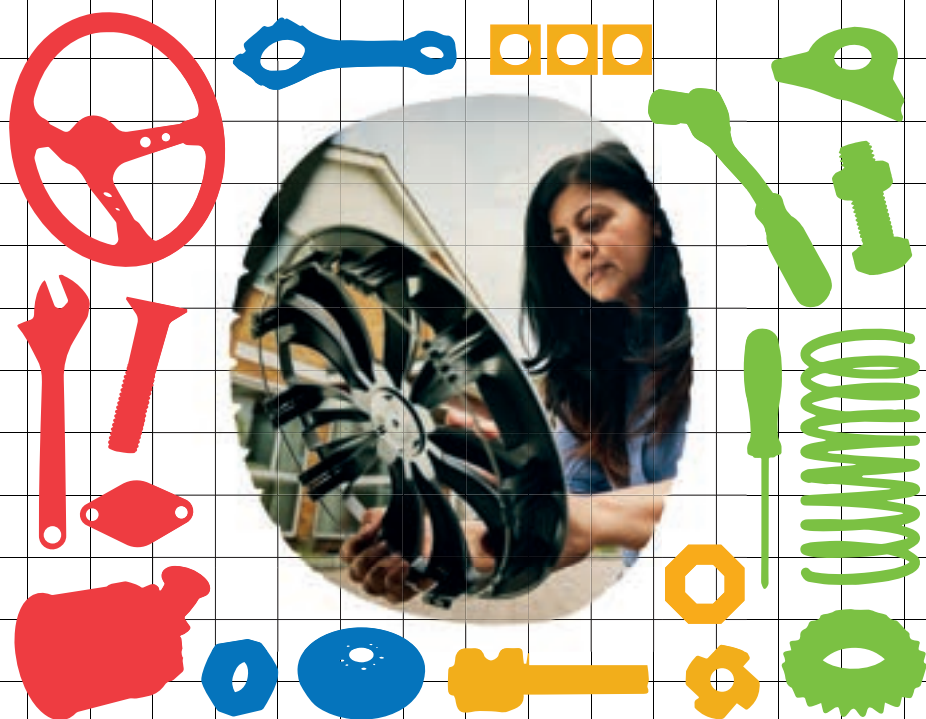
