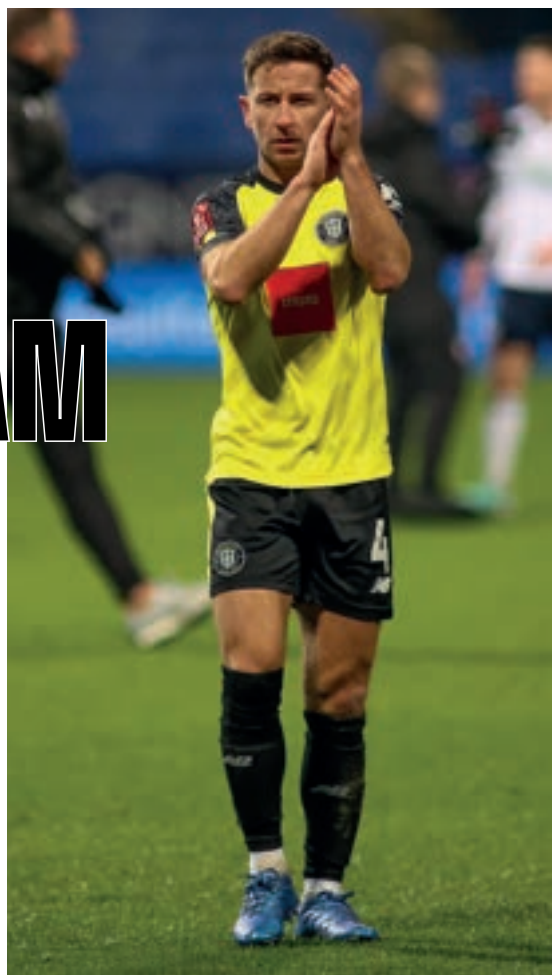

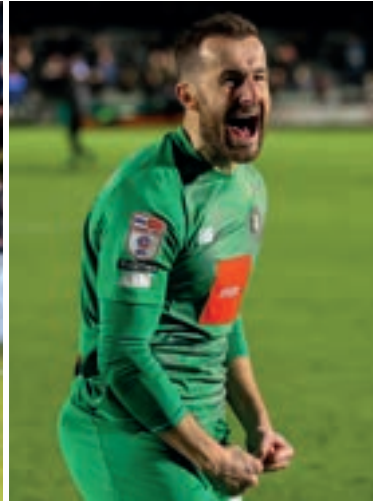

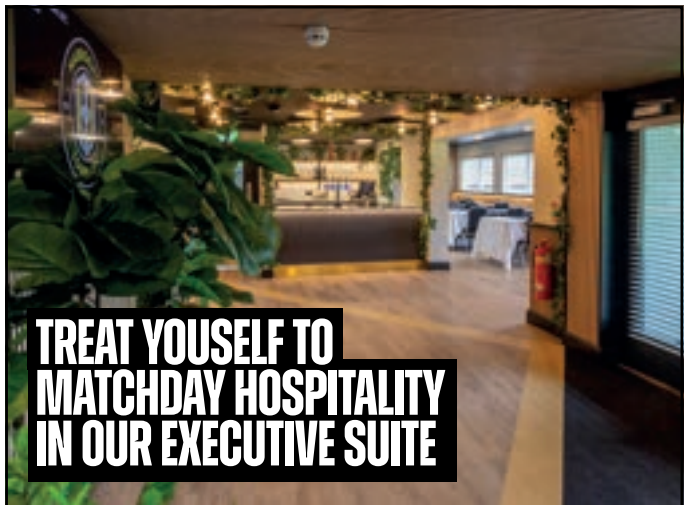

FROM PDC TO ACADEMY



AFTER A MAN OF THE MATCH DISPLAY IN THE FA YOUTH CUP AGAINST BRIGHTON, WE CAUGHT UP WITH FORMER PDC, NOW FIRST YEAR ACADEMY SCHOLAR, ROBBIE WILSON

How has the PDC help you develop as a player?

The PDC helped a lot early on, it was closer to home and the environment was brilliant. I think from the under 14's to 16's season I developed a lot, my understanding of the game and other aspects improved and I developed so much as a player in those seasons at the PDC. It just felt like one big family, everyone loved being there.

Which coaches have had an influence on your development?

Definitely Josh Walsh, he helped out a lot. He was very down to earth with us and as a person he helped you a lot more. It was a lot easier to get advice from him because he wants the best out of any player he coaches. The

coaches have all got the experience and they are all so down to earth with the kids which makes it a lot easier to bond with them as a player.

When you found out you made it into the Academy, what was your reaction?

I was buzzing, I knew it was going to be a big step up though so during the summer I trained as hard as I could. When I was in my under 16's season with the PDC, they send you up to the academy and get as much experience as you can before joining so I had been up a couple of times before and knew the standard they expect. I was buzzing at first but I knew I had to work hard as I didn't want to be out of place when I'm here. My dad was really happy too, I told my grandad as well because he is really supportive and invested in it.

What would your advice be for anyone who is currently in the PDC?

Work hard and listen to what the coaches say because they really helped me through my time there. I think another good thing is Josh Walsh and Josh Law have a really good connection, so they're not going

to be asking too much different from you so as long as you listen from you are told from the coaches, then you'll be alright.

What has been the best part about the PDC has been for you?

The experiences you get, you get to experience different things like playing Liverpool and other teams like that so you get to go experience the level that certain players are at and where you want to get too. Also how close the 18's and 16's are is really good as you get a lot more chances up with the 18's when you

are younger here than you do at most clubs. The games programme just helps it feel a lot more like you're a footballer, you've already got a great bond between everyone and just adding the games programme allows it to make it more serious, it just prepares the PDC a lot more for coming to the academy.

The pathway is also a huge bonus, I had seen Cadarn Taylor and Alfie Lee make the move up and I knew they gave opportunities, they don't just go and pick people from every other club. With the U16's and U18's, it is the same with the U18's and the first team, you get so many opportunities, lads always train with the first team so I think the opportunities you get are really good. It shows with six of them getting pro contracts so far,

so it's definitely a boost knowing that it is a reachable target.

What are your ambitions for the future?

I want to keep in the starting line up. I had an injury at the start of the season which wasn't ideal so when the line up was getting chosen, I wasn't in, but lucky enough Josh trusted me to go back in when I came back and I've started every game since so I just want to stay in and around that starting line up and hopefully get as high up in the league as possible and if not win the league again.

How was it being a part of our FA Youth Cup run this year?

I was really happy to be a part of it, I don't think any of us have had a

feeling like we did at Northampton when we got that winner so I think the experience of having the away games and going away as a team together was amazing. The experience to play a premier league club in such an important cup was fantastic and I think we actually showed them that we deserved to be there, I know the scoreline was 4-1 but if we play the game again, it could of gone a different way, we think Cads' header went over the line so if that was given, then it could of been a different game on another night!

I was involved in the Youth cup game last year on the bench and I was really nervous for that because it was my second time in the team, but this year, I just embraced the feeling, I knew we had a big game in front of us but we prepared really well so I just took the moment as it was rather than being nervous about it. Getting man of the match was a really nice thing to hear, but I think I was more focused on the result. Overall we were happy with the performance we put in and happy to get an assist but it was a great header by Jack Bray of us but we prepared really well so I just took the moment as it was rather than being nervous about it. GIRLS PDC

IT'S NO SECRET THAT THE POPULARITY OF WOMEN'S FOOTBALL IS CONTINUING TO RISE AND HAVING SEEN OUR LIONESSES DO WELL RECENTLY, WE ARE KEEN TO CAPITALISE ON THIS BY GIVING MORE AND MORE GIRLS THE CHANCE TO PLAY WITHIN OUR GIRLS PLAYER DEVELOPMENT CENTRE. WE SPOKE TO JASON BARKER, DIRECTOR OF WOMENS & GIRLS FOOTBALL TO SEE WHAT WE ARE DOING AS A CLUB.

It's hugely important for the club and I that we push the platforms we offer for young women and girls to play football within the district and support like this shows we are on the right path.

As a professional football club, we are keen to use our status to ensure we are continuing to offer the best possible opportunities to those who are in our PDC.

Recently, we introduced a games programme to get girls playing more football. This has been a huge success as we have created a platform in which the players can show what they have learned through their coaching. These girls also have the opportunity to represent Harrogate Town which we believe can help form a strong attachment to this football club.

The PDC and APDC (Advanced Player Development Centre) coaches are brilliant. We have a philosophy which we try to implement as early as possible and I really enjoy working with them. We are always learning stuff from each other, I see things in their sessions which I use in mine and likewise they can come to me for advice and as a result the collective is always improving.

Having been with the club since March, I am really pleased to see everything going to plan so far. We have set out a plan which will take a few years to implement but we are working to rebuild the women's side of the club.

The biggest achievement so far is increasing the number of women and girls who are playing football under the umbrella of Harrogate

Town. We have introduced a reserve team to build up the pathway to the first-team. We are proud of the pathway which we have from the APDC to the reserve side and eventually to the first-team. We are ready to compete and do so with players from the district.

Last season, the Women's side didn't have strength in depth. For us, we want to have our PDC and APDC in a place where they can provide us with the players to improve the Women's team.

As we work to implement and improve on our plan, I am always in dialogue with Josh Walsh and Dave Riley, we want our boys and girls PDC to be united. We want to have a mirrored approach because they have established a great set up in the district and we hope to follow in that path. To do that, it's important that we keep that dialogue open. We are always bouncing ideas off each other and as a group it's always about what we can deliver to the benefit of the PDC and the children who are involved in it.

While we are keen to improve the players within our PDC and APDC, we want to make our environment for football as fun as possible. The coaching of players is a bit more subtle in that way because it's important that the girls enjoy their time and we find ways to maximise that enjoyment. However, having said that, we are still working to make sure that every session has a structure and that is in place to ensure that we make every session exciting while also aiding the players' development.

That is a drive for me, especially with the Soccer Camps, we want to make every camp or every PDC block better than the last. We've had a fantastic response to those camps but we aren't settling for that, all that does is show that we are going in the right direction.

Finally, I'd like to thank all the players, parents, coaches and everyone within the club because the support they have given me has been second to none and above all helped improve what we offer within the Girls Player Development Centre.

JUNIOR PDC

WE SPOKE TO PAUL CLOTHIER, LEAD COACH AT OUR NEWLY RELAUNCHED JUNIOR PDC FOR 5 TO 8 YEAR OLDS BASED AT ROSSETT SPORTS CENTRE

Why did you get into coaching?

It's something I've always wanted to get in to but there had never really been an opportunity until my own daughters started to show an interest in football. I took on the running of my daughter's team at Killinghall Nomads and that was my first step into coaching.

Which coaches have had a big impact on you?

I was a big United fan growing up so people like Carlos Queiroz and Steve McLaren, they were the sort of coaches I was aware of and I would watch their sessions on Youtube. In terms of local coaches, Dave Terzza at Killinghall Nomads who I first started coaching with encouraged me into it.

What do you enjoy most about coaching at the PDC?

I have been a Town fan for years, so being a part of the set up means a lot to me. Even though I do the younger groups, I have high expectations of them so although we try to make it fun, the sessions are all about them developing as footballers. We try to get them to do the right things and the right habits early.

What role does our Academy have in our Player Development Centre?

They are aware of the pathway that the PDC has, I also try to make it clear to them that you're only really talking another 5/6 years until they can be in this position, so I tell them how important it is for them to come to



the sessions and utilise that hour they have with us coaches so they can really try and focus on their football. We have a couple of the Academy players that come down to PDC sessions and help out coaching, so I've had them have a chat with them, which makes it a bit more realistic for the kids.

What does a typical session look like?

With the Junior PDC, I try to incorporate a lot of things that will help them with fine motor skills as much as football skills, so that can be basic movement moving forward, sideways, backwards, moving at speed. With that age group you've got to keep them moving and engaged so a lot of it will be football games with different designed outcomes. They feed off you, so if you're enthusiastic about what you do and show that love for football, they'll buy into it at that age.

With the PDC, I'll often try work on the basics, like body position, moving off the ball and playing in-front of players. With the APDC we just take that up a notch and really learn about positional play, jobs within a team, running into space, covering each other. There is a lot to cover at the age group because you have so much you are trying to teach them!

How important do you feel that particular age group is in their overall development as a footballer?

It's absolutely massive, I think if you start to come into football at age 10/11 and you haven't got the basic

skills and understanding of the game, you're going to be coming in with kids who already have that. You'll find a lot come into the game later, will dip into football and then maybe come back out of it again, as they're not at that level so getting that early understanding into them and building their love of football. A lot of the lads will automatically love football and it will be their life, but quite a few come to the PDC as sometimes it's just something mum and dad want them to try or one of their friends does it. It's important to make them feel welcome, make them feel that they can achieve but also make them feel like they want to get better at football.

What has been the best part about having your own children involved in the PDC from a parents point of view?

I've got three daughters and the standard of coaching they receive and the fact they support the club and come to all the home games is great. They love being part of it so for them, they say they play for the club, that's how they feel. You know they're going to get high quality coaching at the PDC and just having them involved is nice for our whole family.

If you could pass on one key bit of advice to a young footballer what would it be?

Football is all about enjoyment - it's what I say to the kids when I do a drill with them. Enjoy the process of getting better and developing as a player, taking pride in all that you do.

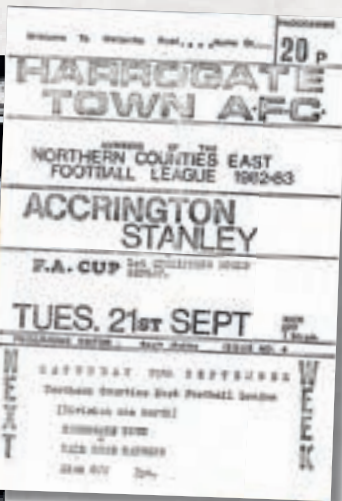
1982/83 SEASON'S FA CUP

The 1982/83 season was the first campaign in the new 'pyramid' which allowed teams to reach the Football League.

Town had left the Yorkshire League having become Champions of League 2 and joined the new Northern Counties East League in Division One North.

This season also saw them playing in the FA Cup for the first time since 1966/67 and after defeating West Auckland Town 3-0, Town were drawn to play at former League club, Accrington Stanley in the First Qualifying Round.

Under player/manager Alan Smith, this was Town's first ever meeting with Accrington (under player/manager Mick Finn) who had gone

from the Cheshire League to North West Counties League.

There was much excitement when Town earned a replay after a creditable 1-1 draw at the Crown Ground with 200 Town fans making the trip to Lancashire. Stanley's side that day included three players from the great Burnley side of the early 1970s including Billy Ingham.

In the replay on Tuesday 21 September 1982 (which was incidentally the first match played under the newly installed floodlights), 2,000 fans turned out at Wetherby Road, and saw Town win 3-1 courtesy of a brace from John Campbell and one from Mick Margis whilst Mick Clarke (absent from first game) scored for Accrington.

The local paper wrote that Town had knocked semi-professional Accrington out of the FA Cup and that it will go down in the annals of Harrogate sporting history remembered by the thousands who turned Wetherby Road into a mini-Wembley, for years to come.

The floodlights meant that Town could now kick off at 3pm on winter afternoons whilst other teams were starting their games at 1.45pm and evening games were now possible.

Manager John Coleman is in his second spell at the club. In over two decades at the club in his two spells at the helm, he has overseen an incredible period of success for the club – including guiding them into the EFL and winning promotion to League One.

Coleman previously managed Stanley from 1999 until 2012, leading them from the Northern Premier League First Division into the Football League.

During his initial 13-year spell with the

Lancashire club, John Coleman guided Stanley to the Conference title in 2006 and stabilised the team in League Two before leaving for League One Rochdale in 2012.

Unable to save Dale from relegation back to the fourth tier, he left Spotland after just 12 months and a five-month spell at Southport followed before a move to Sligo Rovers in Ireland in June 2014 before returning to the Wham Stadium in the September.

Andrews has been a key figure for Accrington this season, starting every league game and scoring five goals.

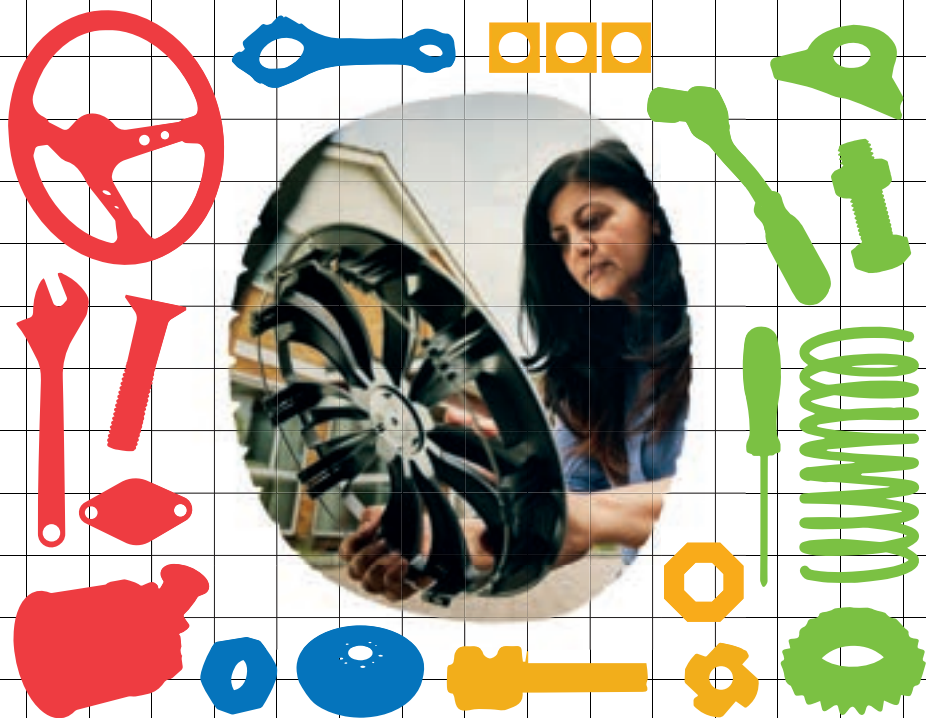
