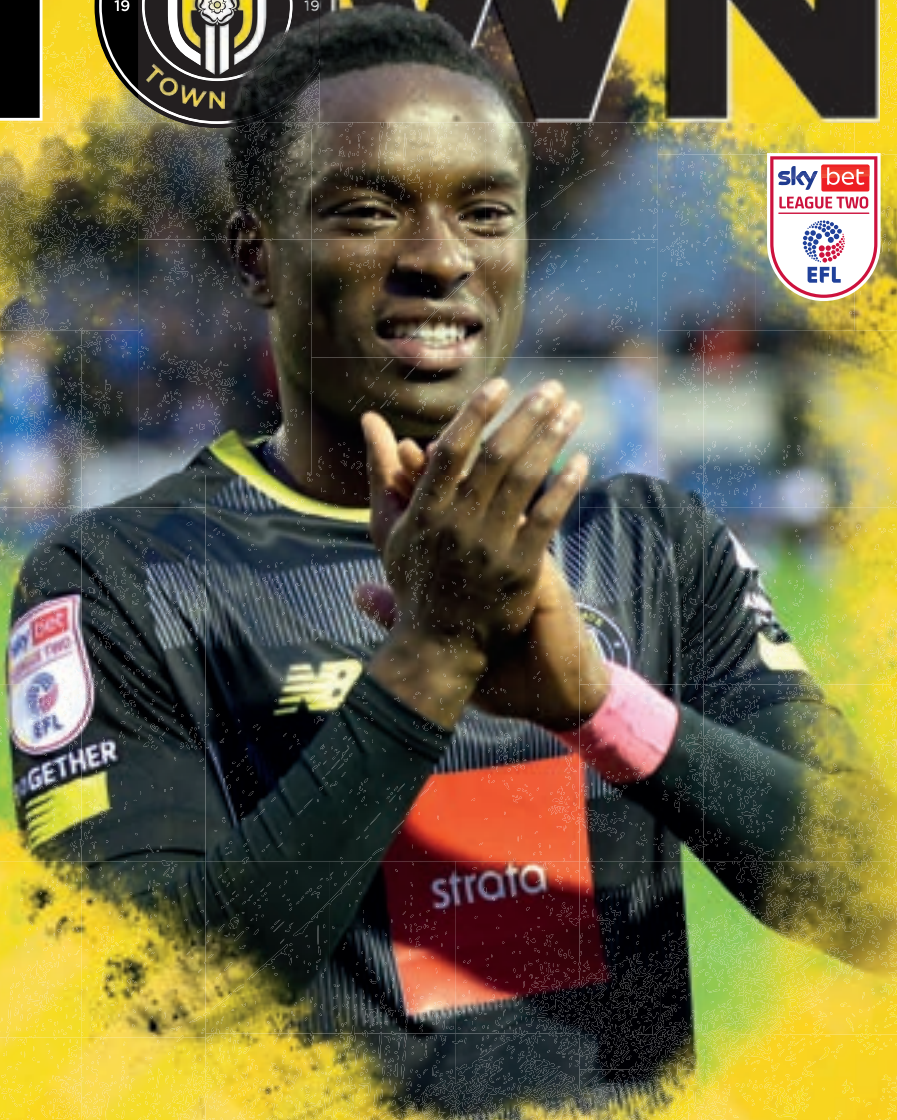

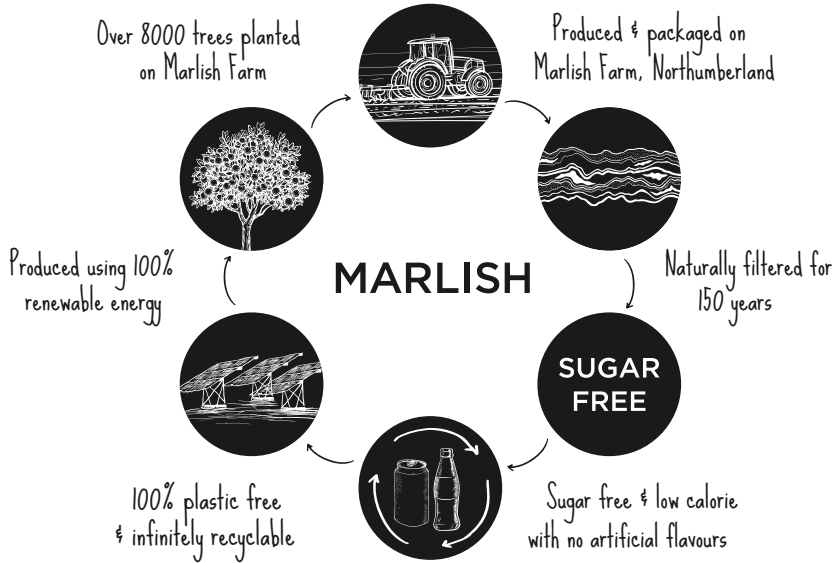

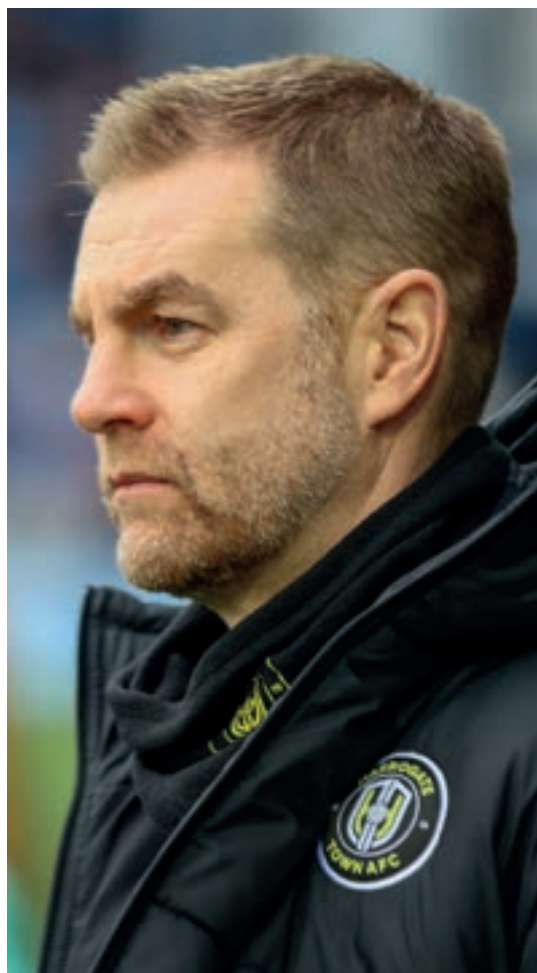

DERRICK ABU

“It was a proud moment for me to represent my country at U17 level, I am a British-Nigerian player so it has always been a big ambition of mine. I had the opportunity to play for both Germany and Nigeria already but I think England is the best place for my development right now.

“With my parents being Nigerian, I have ambitions to represent Nigeria at senior level. I am extremely proud of my heritage, it’s a goal I have for my career and hopefully I can go on and achieve that.

“Watching that tournament was where it really hit home for me, I came away from watching that feeling encouraged and motivated because I seen how far my country can go in tournaments like that.”

Despite his Nigerian roots, Abu has spent most of his years so far in West London where his family moved from Germany over 15 years ago.

“My parents met in Germany, they lived there for 12 years or something

and then my sister and I were born. After that, we moved to England when I was three and the rest they say is history.

“We settled in west London, I’ve always been a west London boy. As a family, we didn’t have very much so I didn’t have the best upbringing but I’ve always enjoyed it.

“When I was young, I started playing football with my friends which was one of the best things about my childhood.

“I latched on to football in a way, I felt I was quicker and stronger than the players around me so I used that to my advantage. When I realised that, I joined my local grassroots side and from there I felt like I was improving a lot as a footballer.

“I think that helped me to improve my understanding of the game, it was a team environment and there was a sense of togetherness there which helped to get the best out of me.”

HAVING BEEN BORN TO NIGERIAN PARENTS, TOWN LOANEE DERRICK ABU HAS REVEALED HIS MOTIVATION TO PLAY INTERNATIONALLY HAS BEEN FURTHER HEIGHTENED BY THE RECENT SUCCESS OF THE SUPER EAGLES IN THE AFRICA CUP OF NATIONS TOURNAMENT.

THE FULL-BACK, WHO CAN REPRESENT EITHER GERMANY, ENGLAND OR NIGERIA, HAS ALREADY FEATURED AT U17 LEVEL FOR ENGLAND. HOWEVER, IS CLEAR ON HIS DESIRE TO MAKE HIS FAMILY PROUD.

INTERVIEW BY NICKOLAS MCINALLY

Despite a passion for football, Abu’s journey was only just beginning as he boarded a plane bound for Spain and to play in a youth tournament.

“When I was about 11, I was picked to go to Spain and play in a tournament over there. I felt like I had played really well in that tournament, while I was there I knew of a lot of interest in me.

“Some of the club’s I could have gone to were quite far away, luckily for me Chelsea were on my doorstep. I was living with my mum at the time and she gave me the encouragement to go for it with Chelsea.

“It was a huge step for me but looking back I have no regrets I am extremely happy that I chose to make that decision.”

As the right-back began his journey with The Blues, Abu believes this early exposure to the club helped him to achieve his aim of becoming a professional footballer.

“Playing for a club like that, they have



the best coaches, they have the best facilities and I was benefitting from that right from the age of 11.

"I definitely learned a lot from my coaches, working with them was a bit of a blessing to be honest. I was playing with great players too, having seen where they have come from, it is really good to see them achieve some great things in the game so far.

"I was also a Chelsea fan growing up, I was also playing for my dream club so it was a very proud moment for me and my family when I signed my scholarship.

"I am very keen to achieve in the game too. I am hungry to keep going, keep progressing and working hard. If I can keep doing that then I am sure the opportunities will come soon enough."

Looking back on his time with the club, the 20-year-old admits he is grateful for the opportunities to learn from the club's senior figures.

"As a young pro, I had several opportunities to train with the first-team which I knew I had to make the most of. I came away from those opportunities knowing I had left everything on the pitch to impress.

"I really enjoyed the experience of playing alongside world class players. Watching them prepare and train, I learned more about what I needed to do to get the best of myself."

"Reece James and Jorginho were the players who really helped to set the standard. They were consistent and showed their quality in every single training session.

"Of course, Reece plays in my position too so he was the perfect role model for me. Having come through the academy, I have seen him kick on and develop at every level.

"I've seen him go out on loan and use that to make an impact. He is a massive inspiration for me and I have been fortunate enough to train with him too so that has been really good."



However, with a desire to prove himself at senior level, Abu chose to leave the club in the summer. Having reflected on the decision, the right-back was keen to take a leap out of his comfort zone.

"When the time did come to leave Chelsea, I knew it was the right decision for me. I was there for 10 years but I wanted a challenge which forced me to step out of my comfort zone.

"I wanted to prove myself, especially in men's football so the decision to move on was part of that process. I am happy I have made that decision and as a Southampton player I have to keep progressing now. Everyone knows the record Southampton have for developing players, they have a great academy system there and when they presented the project to me it just made sense.

"It was hard for my mum at first, I had lived with her all my life but now I was leaving. However, I felt ready for this step. I wanted to grow into a man and I knew that I was only an hour and a half away from home if I needed to go back.

"The club have been very keen for me to get out there and play games. They wanted me to go out on loan in the summer but unfortunately nothing materialised.

"I had six months of training with the first-team and playing for the U23 side but I knew I needed to experience men's football to progress. When the opportunity came to sign for Harrogate, I was very keen to get the deal done.

"The six months, I was living away and cooking for myself, looking after myself and learning to pay bills like myself. All of that is quite a big change so now I am more used to that I am looking forward to hopefully kicking on here.

"The plan the club has for me is very reassuring, I feel confident in that plan and know exactly what we are working towards. If I didn't have that, I feel like the lack of preparation could end up impacting my momentum as a player."

The loan deal would subsequently be complete on deadline day. However, having only trained once with his new team mates, Abu was thrown



in at the deep end at league leaders Stockport as Town were held to a 1-1 draw.

"It was a little bit of a stressful day to be honest, I knew it was likely to happen but it went right to deadline day before I was told I would be moving up.

"I trained that day and went home, at that point it was a little bit up in the air. When it went through, I had to pack my things up and jump in my car straight away.

"I was driving five hours to come North and I remember feeling excited while driving up. This is the opportunity I have been working towards my whole life so I am very keen to see it become a reality.

"The coaches here have been very honest with me, they want me to express myself and go and show what I can do. They told me I was going to play and that I would have a responsibility to this group.

"I like that feeling, I like knowing that I have the trust of the people around me. I was thrown in the deep end against Stockport but that gave me

confidence and belief that this club was right for me."

With the club unbeaten until last midweek, Abu admits the challenge of joining a team in that run of form was one which excited him.

"We are in such a good position right now, we are looking up the way and trying to battle with the teams above us. We have shown the quality we have and to fit in with a group like that is really pleasing.

"The game against Stockport was exciting, I felt like I had taken that opportunity well and it felt great to enjoy that moment especially when I told my family I would be starting.

"For me, that game was a perfect summary of why I play football. We had the fans chanting, we caused them problems and had to defend well at times but thankfully we got a point for our efforts.

"I am a couple of games in now but I know in time I will show my full potential at this football club. I've had a run of starts now and I feel like that has been important in allowing me to settle.

"Every game, I go out there knowing that I need to prove myself. It's a great group of lads here and they have been so trusting in me, I am excited for what is to come.

"Coming here, the aim is to keep fighting and finish as high up the league table as possible. Being around the group for nearly two weeks now, I have seen the levels we are capable of reaching so now it's about showing that."

Abu is also keen to make an impact in the world of music, having performed and released music under the name Cho\$en. Speaking on this venture, Abu believes this has helped to truly showcase his ability on the pitch.

"It's a challenge to balance my football with my music. However, that is a challenge which I love having. Of course, we have a lot of free time as footballers and in that time I like to write my own music.

"I was always into performing arts at school, I performed in plays and sang as part of the church choir. I knew it was a tough industry to get into but I thought I had nothing to lose."

"Doing that, I am being true to myself, expressing myself and I feel happy. Getting into that headspace is important for me because it means I can give my all on the pitch.

"In the summer, I had the opportunity to perform abroad too which was a surreal experience. It helped me to relax and refocus myself away from football for a bit.

"Right from the beginning, I have had a lot of support for my work from the footballing world. That has been a little bit overwhelming to be honest because everyone has been so supportive."



BACK IN TIME

In the Colchester United programme I covered Town's last ever Northern Premier league (Unibond) game at Wetherby Road on 17 April 2004 and this week I am covering Town's last ever Northern Premier league match of the season which was played a week later against Ashton United at their Hurst Cross Stadium on Saturday 24 April.

In an absolutely thrilling game from start to finish Town won 4-3. Ashton's Martyn Allison opened the scoring in the 36th minute before James Turley (pictured right) equalised six minutes later. Town took the lead through James Riordan in the 53rd-minute only for Paul Garvey to tie things up again in the 61st-minute. With seven minutes left to play, Colin Hunter looked to have scored the winner for Town on 85 minutes only for Lincoln Adams to make it 3-3 in the 88th minute. That wasn't the end of it however as Town's top scorer Turley won the game on 90 minutes.

I managed to get a picture of that winning goal (pictured above) from this exciting game. 274 fans turned up for this game and the teams were.

Town had to finish in the top 13 in order to qualify for the new Conference North the following season and so they did, finishing fifth. Ashton unfortunately finished fourteenth but if they had beaten Town in that last game would have qualified. Ashton did compete in a play-off but lost to Bradford Park Avenue in the semi-finals. However, after demise of Telford United an

extra place became available and Ashton took their place in the Conference North.

Town's Turley finished top scorer with 19 league and cup goals and Ashton's Paul Garvey finished with 15.

Turley, a Wetherby Road favourite picked up the last player of the match award to go with his general supporters and supporters club player of the year awards.

On 66 minutes Town made the breakthrough. It was a well-worked move down the right wing with Brodella and Ilesanmi interchanging well. Brodella fired the ball low across the face of goal and Bray was in the right place at the right time to sweep the ball home from close range.

Two minutes later Town made it two-nil with Brodella adding his name to the scoresheet as he took a long ball down with a delightful touch which took it right into his path for him to strike the ball past the keeper.

A minute later, Town could've made it three in three minutes as Ilesanmi had a great opportunity as he was played through on goal (v) but he couldn't find the corner with his effort which ended up in the keeper's hands.

As the game entered the final 20 minutes, Town had a comfortable grip on the game with a two-goal lead having grown in confidence and

MEET SOME KEY MEN FOR THE SADDLERS



DONERVON DANIELS

Club captain, Daniels joined Walsall in January 2022. The 30-year-old began his career at West Bromwich Albion, and whilst there, had loan spells at Tranmere Rovers, Gillingham, Blackpool and Aberdeen. He then moved to Wigan Athletic in 2015 before joining Rochdale on loan for the 2017-18 season. In 2018, he joined Blackpool before joining Luton Town in the Championship a year later. A loan spell at Doncaster Rovers followed before he made the switch to Crewe in the summer of 2020.



ROSS TIERNEY

Arriving on a season-long loan from Scottish Premiership side Motherwell in July, the 22-year-old began his career in Ireland with Bohemians, making his debut at the age of 18. The midfielder's performances caught the eye of Motherwell and he signed with them in January 2022. Tierney has scored four times so far for Motherwell, including strikes against Celtic and Rangers and also has nine Ireland U21s caps to his name. Recently returning from injury, he scored in the Saddlers win in midweek.



JAMILLE MATT

Jamille Matt joined the Saddlers in January 2023. The 33-year-old has a keen eye for goal, being the third highest goalscorer in Sky Bet League Two in the 2021-22 season with 19 goals.

Matt began his career with Sutton Coldfield Town and has also represented Kidderminster Harriers, Fleetwood Town, Stevenage, Plymouth Argyle, Blackpool and Grimsby Town. He left Blackpool at the end of the 2017-18 season and joined Newport that summer where his career took off as he scored 26 goals in 98 matches, with 20 of them coming in the 2018-19 campaign that saw the Exiles reach the play-off final.

In the summer of 2020, he joined Forest Green Rovers and scored 17 goals in his first season as Rovers finished in the play-off places. Matt improved his tally in his second season at the Bolt New Lawn, netting 20 to help Forest Green win League Two 2022. In total, he netted 39 goals in two and half seasons in Gloucestershire.

He impressed in his first season at the Bescot, scoring eight goals and has registered 10 goals so far this season as well as six assists.



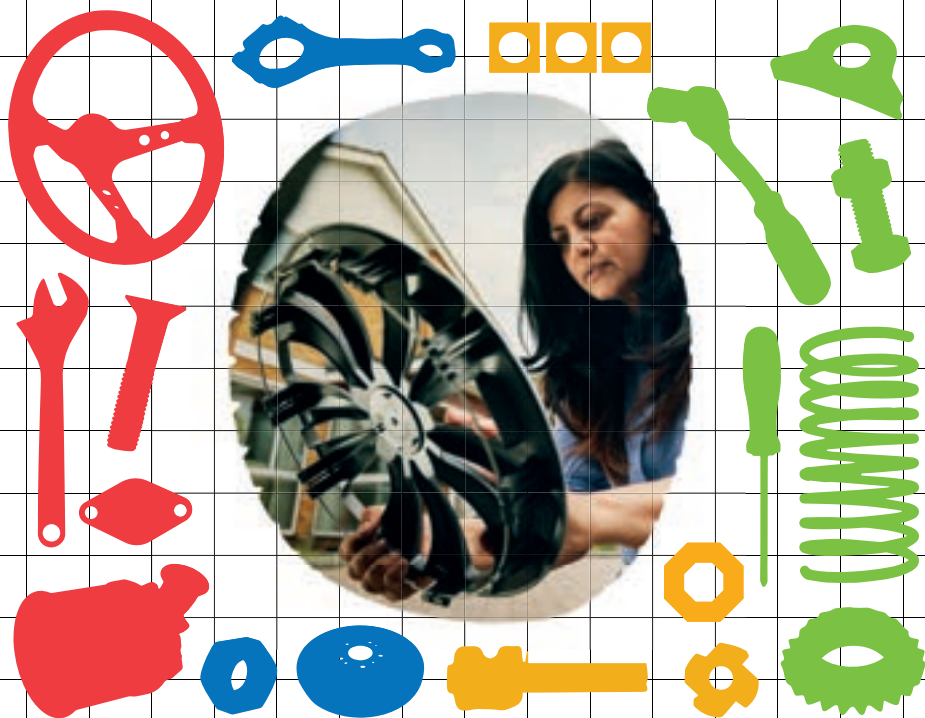
